

From the Principal Term 4 Week 2

Welcome back everyone for the last school term of 2013! How time gets away. It seems only yesterday we were beginning our school year. We have a very full Term 4 planned with student assessments, written reports, end of year functions and planning for the 2014 school organisation. The warmer weather is definitely here. All our students are required to wear hats on the playground. Our rule "No Hat No Play" applies on all open playground areas. Children who do not have a hat will have to play under the COLA areas. Please make sure your child's hat comes to school with them. It is a sound idea too, to make sure children have sunscreen applied before they arrive at school and that extra drinks are supplied in their lunch boxes during hotter weather. We are very fortunate that our generous P&C and parent community have raised funds to ensure all our classrooms are air-conditioned. Thank you for ensuring your children are in full summer school uniform. They really look smart.

Staff Changes

A huge thank you goes to **Mr Dan Betts** for effectively and efficiently leading and managing our school during my absence at the end of Term 3. Thank you to **Mr Andrew Brady** for stepping up to relieve as Assistant Principal and managing Stage 3 while Mr Betts was relieving as Principal. Thank you to **Mrs Kerrie Stewart** as well for also stepping up and managing Stage 1 in Mr Rob Steller's absence. The school was in sound hands. We have some staff changes for this term as well. Mr Rob Steller will remain on leave until 25th October with **Mr Matthew Bradbury** continuing the educational program for 2S. **Mrs Kerrie Stewart** will relieve as Assistant Principal for Stage 1 during this time. Miss Rae Campbell will not return to us this term and **Miss Sally Whatnall** will continue with the educational program for 2C. Mrs Karen Keenan will also not return to us this term and **Miss Chris Dos** will continue the educational program for KK. **Mrs Jill Hunt** is on leave at present and will return on 23rd October to take over 5/6HR for the full 5 days a week as **Mrs Young** will leave us to make ready for the birth of her baby. Mr Andrew Kinniburgh is working with Gosford District Office over the next 3 weeks with **Mrs Michelle Green** continuing the educational program for the Special ED class. During Mr Kinniburgh's, secondment **Mrs Leanne Wiliame** will relieve in the capacity of Assistant Principal Support with the responsibility of managing all of our Special Needs students throughout the school. **Mrs Lisa Mills** will return for 2 days a week after 14th November to share KMP with **Mrs Chris Price**. Mr Dan Betts will take leave around the 30th October for a period of 3 weeks to be with his wife after the arrival of their baby. **Mr Peter Smith** will relive as Assistant Principal for Stage 3 during that time. A few changes, but our students are very familiar with all of the teaching staff working in our school and as always the educational programs will continue for all students without interruption.

NAPLAN 2013

Year 3 and 5 students will be given their NAPLAN result information letters this Wednesday. Please look out for these in your child's bag. The school has been able to access the NAPLAN results on the Department of Education and Communities Smart Data site to assess what our students knew and could do and compare these results to other schools like us, schools in our Peninsula area, Hunter Central Coast Schools and against State results. Highlights for NAPLAN this year are:

- Year 5 girls (27 of our students) have improved by 36 scale points (Mean) from the 2012 data in the test aspect of Grammar and Punctuation.
- In growth, Year 5 girls are 53 scale points above the state average in the test aspect of Grammar and Punctuation.

I will provide some more detailed analysis of the NAPLAN results in the next newsletter after all parents have received their child's result letter. If you have any questions or concerns about your child's result information please do not hesitate to contact your the class teacher, stage manager or me, to discuss these.

Selective High School applications for 2015

Applications for students seeking selective high school placement in Year 7 in 2015 will be available from 15th October 2013. Most parents are expected to apply online at www.schools.nsw.edu.au/shsplacement.

For parents without internet access, paper application forms will be available from the school from 22nd

October 2013. All students seeking Year 7 entry to a selective high school in 2015 will be required to take the Selective High School Placement Test on the morning of Thursday 13 March 2014. Students in Year 5 now will be given a letter explaining the selective high school process and information and a form to fill in and return to school outlining their intentions to proceed with an application on line or on paper, if internet access is not available. Disabled parking zones around the school

You would have noticed some newly marked disabled car park spaces around our school. We now have one in Park Road, 2 on Bowden Road and one designated space in the teachers Bowden Road car park. We are a school with 70 special needs students and quite a few of these students travel with special transport supplied by the Department of Education and Communities. Small mini buses and special taxis drop off and pick up these students, hence the disabled car parking was requested by the school from Gosford City Council for this reason. A number of parents with special needs children at our school also need to park in these designated parks for easy drop off and pick up. To make it easy for everyone we have instructed the special transport vehicles to drop off and pick up on the Bowden Road side of the school. The special transport arrives on the Bowden Road side to drop off special needs students between 8:15 and 9:00am and picks them back up from 2:30 – 3:00pm. Please make sure the spaces are available at these times for our special transport drop off and pick ups. The disabled car space on Park Road is always available for parents picking up special needs students. Thank you for your support with this matter.

New Additions

I hope you have all been doing the Colorbond add thing and admiring the new shiny Preschool roof. This is such a fantastic plus for our school. No more leaks! The roof cavity on the Early Intervention classroom was cleared of debris and new insulation put in. Macca has been busy during the break tidying up the grounds and making everything look ship shape. Thank you Macca. More scheduled maintenance is planned with the ramp entry on the Aboriginal Community room being updated. Outside work will take place on the Early Intervention room and extra drainage will be put under the big COLA area to make sure the rain water excess that runs into that area is getting away quickly. Some more new carpeting will go into the Administration Office block as well. Lots of improvements to look forward to.

Parent Online payments

A new online payment portal linked to our school's website has been launched. This will make it much easier for you to pay for school related payments. This is a secure page hosted by Westpac. Expenses that can be paid on this site are Voluntary School Contributions, sales to students as in text books and paper levy, excursions, sport, school events and visiting school shows. The site went live on 14th October 2013. To make a payment you log onto the School Website. www.woywoy-pschools.nsw.edu.au

Click on "Make a Payment" and follow the prompts to make a payment via Visa or Mastercard. All payments are secure and the school receives student payments receipted in the normal way. Please be aware that payment on line needs to be made by 6pm for the school to receive it the following business day. Payments made after 6pm will be received by the school a day later. Your credit/debit card details are not ever passed on to the school. I am sure this process of school payments will make it much easier for busy families and bring our school payment system up to date with current business practice.

P&C 2014 Operation

At present our P&C run the Canteen and the Uniform shop as well as organising fundraising through term Discos, Mothers' and Fathers' Day stalls and various other planned activities throughout a year. Numbers of P&C organisation personnel have diminished considerably over the last few years and with our current President, Mrs Fiona Fry, off to America for the next 2 years there will be spaces left needed to run the Uniform shop, the Fundraising committee and the Canteen. I am aware that many parents jump in with support and help with all the P&C activities we run, but if we do not have a meeting quorum for P&C business, then our P&C would not be able to operate. There has to be a formal meeting to be able to approve the business the P&C want to do and to distribute the funds raised correctly. This is a legal requirement. Please get behind our P&C, become a member, take on a role. There are generally 2 to 3 meetings a term which consist of 2 day time and 1 night time meeting and giving up around an hour a week to follow up on P&C business, most of which can be done at home. It would be a great loss to the school to lose the services of our generous P&C. How would we cope without a Canteen or a Uniform shop? Think of the inconveniences for everyone. The P&C Annual General Meeting is coming up in the second week of November on Thursday 14th. We need you so come along and support your school through the P&C.

2014 School organisation

There is not much of the 2013 year left and it will soon be time to look at the school structure, set up and organisation for 2014. As our newsletter goes out fortnightly now, it is important that I mention it is time for you as parents to give some thought about the placement of your children for the 2014 class structures. As always, it is important to remember that students are placed in classes to enhance their learning opportunities with sound teacher professional knowledge backed up with assessment and work task results and classroom teacher observation expertise on the educational, social and emotional growth of a child. We do welcome your input in this process if you believe there are extenuating circumstances that need to be considered when placing your child in a class for 2014. If this is so, you are welcome to make an appointment to meet with me and discuss this matter. Alternately you can put your concerns in writing and address the correspondence to me. Please always remember this process is totally confidential. A few very reasonable requests have already been sent to me. This process will need to be finalised by the middle of November so we are ready to begin the class structure for 2014 and publish it before the summer holidays.

Good Grief: Seasons For Grow

Woy Woy Public School is again offering the Seasons for Growth program starting Week 2 Term 4.

This program will be offered, initially, to Stage 3 children who may have experienced grief due to a significant loss. This grief response may have been triggered by a number of reasons including **death**

of a family member or friend; family **separation** or **divorce** and other significant changes to a child's life. The program will be offered to Stage 1 and 2 in 2014

This educational program teaches children strategies to help cope with change, loss and grief in their lives. It allows children to normalise change and helps them to validate the feelings and emotions associated with change. For the effectiveness of the program, it is a requirement that the children who attend the course be 6 months after the event of grief taking place. The children will meet peers in a small, confidential group accompanied by Mr. Sam Collins, a trained facilitator. The main course runs over eight weeks, plus a celebration session, and will be conducted in school hours.

The application forms go out this week and need to be returned to Mr. Sam Collins as soon as possible.
