From the Principal Term 4 Week 6, 2014

Teachers will have the next two days doing professional development.

Kindergarten transition to school starts

A very successful morning was held for our new Kindergarten parents and children last Wednesday 5th November. Children experienced their first morning in the big school classrooms while their parents caught up on valuable information about how to support their child beginning school. You could tell by the smiles on their little faces that the children had lots of fun at school. The transition program will continue over the next three Wednesdays with the final visit including a Teddy Bears picnic. Woy Woy Public School is looking forward to being part of these new children's educational journey. Swimming Scheme

The annual swim school offered to Year 2 children and other children who cannot swim or who are not confident in water from Years 3 and 4, is in progress for 2014. Our students have been walking down to the Peninsula Leisure Centre to take part in water confidence and water safety lessons. In our island country Australia, a big part of most people's leisure time is spent around water and/or doing water activities. It is so important that our children know how to keep themselves safe around water. The swim school is a wonderful opportunity for children to learn these very necessary skills. The swim school will continue until the end of this week.

Disabilities Program classes go to camp

For 3 days of last week, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday our Disabilities Program classes enjoyed the excitement of going on a sport and recreation camp at Mangrove Mountain. When I rang Mr Andrew Kinniburgh to see how everyone was going I could hear beautiful, excited and happy students having the time of their lives. I have heard many of them attempted and experienced things they had never done before. What a wonderful opportunity for our students with special needs. They spent two nights and three days away from school and family supported by their teachers and learning support officers as well as the staff at the camp. So many thanks to our support class teachers and learning support officers for the extra duties you did to support these students, feeding, showering, dressing, encouraging, and



just being there twenty four hours a day.

School structure 2015

Thank you to the parents who have made appointments to see me personally or have written in regarding their concerns around student placement next year in 2015. All considerations are confidential. We will be looking at class structure and placement in a couple of weeks so please if you would like the opportunity to express concerns about your child's placement do it as soon as possible.

Staffing for 2015

Presently we have an open advertisement running for the position of Assistant Principal to fill Mr Kevin Lane's position at our school. This closes on Wednesday 12 November. The merit selection panel will then meet to go through all the applications to decide on who should progress to interview where a successful candidate will be chosen. We will know who our new Assistant Principal will be in about two weeks from Wednesday. Also, an open advertisement for a teacher position will go live online this week and, as with the Assistant Principal position, we will know in a few weeks who our new teacher will be. Another teacher position is being looked at with a third to be allocated by staffing. These are positions previously held by Mrs Karen Keenan, Ms Rae Campbell and Mr Evan Long. Given these arrangements, it is hard to put teachers to classes for 2015 at this stage. Also some of our permanent staff have opted to work part time next year. Some 3 days a week, some 4 days a week. This is within staffing guidelines and does give the opportunity for our wonderful casual teacher staff to still be part of our school.

It was fantastic to see you all come for our parent forum and add your view. We have gained a wealth of information to help us plan future directions for our school. We are now tabulating the information gathered and will soon have it ready for you to have a look at. The information so far is guiding us in 3 directions - innovative teaching and learning, positive community and quality systems in which to operate. Once we have all the information tabulated we will be asking you to help by suggesting ways and means of achieving what we all want for our children. Thank you for your much appreciated support.

Consideration of some new uniform items

We had an extremely positive response for our consideration to change some of our uniform items. There are now many more things to consider before we can execute these changes. We would like to start the discussion on where to go now at the next P&C meeting on this Thursday night. The P&C meeting week starts with the Annual General Meeting to vote in the new positions for 2015. It will be held in the staffroom starting at 7:00pm. The P&C do a fantastic job by raising funds to support all children at the school by providing extra opportunities and things for them to enhance their education and by supporting the school with advice and community support.
