They visited The Australian Institute of Sport, The Australian Mint, Questacon, The Australian War Memorial, Parliament House, The National Art Gallery, Regatta Point Exhibition Centre, The National Dinosaur Museum and participated in an electoral education program at The Old Parliament House.

The Australian Government recognises the importance of all young Australians being able to visit the national capital as part of their Civics and Citizenship education. To assist families in meeting the cost of the excursion the Australian Government is contributing funding of \$20 per student under the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate program towards those costs. The rebate is paid directly to the school upon completion of the excursion.

The children and teachers had a wonderful experience on this excursion. The children's behaviour and commitment to all activities was exemplary and they can be very proud of the manner in which they represented Woy Woy Public School.

Information for parents and students

School travel passes only need to be updated when a student:

- · changes address, or
- changes school or campus.

A new application is required when:

- applying for an SSTS pass for the first time,
- enrolling in Kindergarten,
- progressing from Year 2 to Year 3,
- progressing from Year 6 to Year 7, or
- requesting an additional pass as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation.


