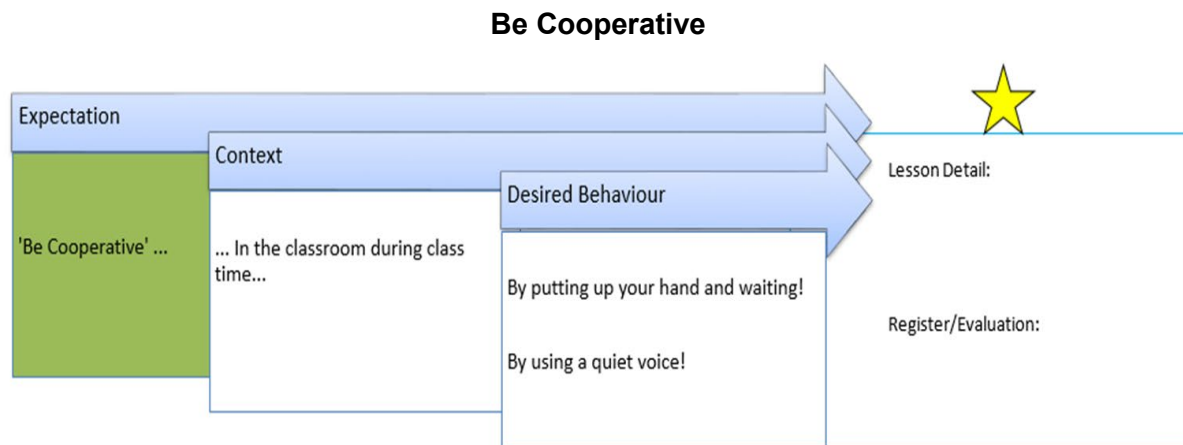

Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) Weeks 1, 2, 3 & 4



The PBL focus for the first 2 weeks of this term has been 'Be Safe' when playing games. Teachers have reinforced the importance of taking turns so that everyone playing the game has an equal opportunity to get involved, and playing by the rules set down for each particular game so that everyone feels like they've had a fair go. More generally, teachers have taken the opportunity to discuss the concepts of 'fair play' and 'good sportsmanship' to ensure all students are kept safe while participating in group games.

The PBL focus for the next fortnight will be '**Be Cooperative**' in particular following teacher instruction in the classroom. Students who successfully demonstrate cooperative behaviour will be rewarded with Win Bin tickets and stars on their Star Charts.

Students who have successfully achieved 27 stars on their Star Charts this term will be eligible to receive their Silver Award and their PBL reward for term 3. This term successful students will be able to choose a token of their choice as a reward.

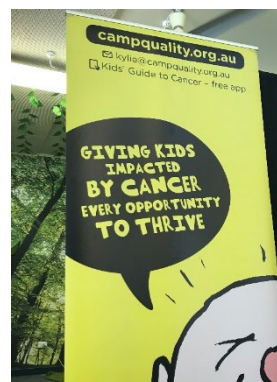
We start at 2.50pm near the fixed equipment and finish about 3.30pm. Parents usually accompany their children as it is after school, and we have some quiet games and a chat.

Messages from the Office

Important Parking Message

The staff parking area inside the school gates on both Park Road and Bowden Road is for **Staff Use Only**. Parents dropping off and collecting their children from school, Music Bus or Cubbyhouse BASC are asked to park outside the school grounds and walk their children to and from their car. This is a Department of Education directive.

Office Hours

School phones are manned from 8.30am until 3.15pm. The office window is opened at 8.30am and closed at 3.00pm however office staff are available until 3.15pm. There is a teacher on duty at the bus lines until 3.20pm.

Changes to Going Home Arrangements

Could you please ensure that your child is aware of how they will be going home in the afternoon. If these arrangements change during the day it would be appreciated if you could contact the office prior to 2.00pm to ensure that the message is passed on to your child.

Skoolbag APP and Website

You can download the WWPS Skoolbag APP to both iPhone and Android devices. Event updates and important information will be sent out via our Skoolbag APP and you can record your child's absence from school here as well. Student Mobile Phones

Students who bring their mobile phone to school are asked to leave them at the office on their arrival and collect it at the end of the school day. Students are not permitted to have their phone with them during the day. It is also helpful if their name is on their phone.

Late Arrival / Early Departure

If your child is late arriving to school or needs to leave early for an appointment, a partial absence slip is to be collected from the school office prior to going to your child's classroom. This slip is given to the classroom teacher.

Payment of Money to the School

School fees and activity costs can be paid by credit card via the Woy Woy Public School website (<http://www.woywoy-p.schools.nsw.edu.au/>) using the 'Make a Payment' tab. If you are making a cash payment please place the money in an envelope with the child's name, class and the reason clearly noted. We have cash collection envelopes at the school office for your use. All money is to be given to your child's teacher. When making payments for multiple children, separate money and envelopes for each child is appreciated, as it is very time-consuming to sort out at the time of receipting.

 - Delivery EVERY FRIDAY

Option 3 Buy direct from the shop

1. 3rd Thursday morning of the month 8.30-9.00am CA Room (during school term)
2. Eftpos and correct cash accepted
3. Email orders and returns/exchanges from email orders are NOT processed on open days and will not be available for pickup.

FAQ

What if I order the wrong size?

That's fine just email wwpsuniforms@outlook.com advising the issue and return the item to the office within 14 days WITH TAGS ON and NOT WORN and the replacement will be delivered next delivery day.

I only have cash how can I order?

Please note this process may take an extra week to process. Correct money with the order in a sealed envelope can be left at the office.

Refund, Exchange & Returns Policy

The Uniform Shop will accept returns and provide customers with an exchange, refund or repair where the customer can provide adequate proof of purchase by way of receipt and the following terms and conditions are followed:

- Exchanges can only be made within 14 days of purchase.
- No refund will be given for an incorrect size choice only an exchange and the item must have original tag and have not been washed and is in an "as new" condition.
- All faulty items need to be reviewed by the manufacturer before a decision is made regarding refund, repair or exchange.
- Any item to be reviewed by the manufacturer needs to be returned in a clean and freshly laundered condition.
- The Uniform Shop will not hand out replacement items until the manufacturer has decided on repair, refund or exchange. This process may take several weeks.
- All decisions will be notified to the customer.
- The Uniform Shop reserves the right not to offer an exchange, refund or repair on items where the item fault is the result of misuse, neglect or incorrect washing instructions of the item.
- The Uniform Shop reserves the right to assess the condition and age of returned goods prior to providing a repair, refund or exchange. This may result in repair, refund or exchange being refused.
- If a refund is granted, the refund will be issued using the original payment method.

Pearl Beach Aboriginal History Group

The group was founded by a dedicated band of Pearl Beach residents in 2015 to better understand the local Aboriginal history and honour this history by sharing it with the wider community.

One of our group members shares stories of his ancestral line of the Wongahook people with us and a designated group member works closely with the Guringu Tribal Link Corporation to ensure the authenticity of our information.

After extensive research conducted in the first year PBAHG produced the book, *Bungaree's Mob - The Warrak Trigg Way Penitentiary and Beyond*, and a new revised edition was published in 2018. It is on sale at the Pearl Beach Store and local bookshops or by emailing us at the address below. It is also available in the State Library of NSW, the National Library, the University of Sydney Library and all local libraries.

Our events have included 3 Film Festivals with Q & A Sessions by the filmmakers, an Aboriginal Astronomy Night, Weaving Workshops, Historical and Artefacts Exhibitions, Bushwalks to local caves and rock art sites and a Q & A afternoon tea with local historian Bob Punkhurst.

This year we've planned an entire weekend of exciting events on the 22nd - 24th November to celebrate and commemorate the life of Bungaree, a remarkable local Aboriginal man, who died on November 24th 1830. Coming up in early 2020 we will hold our annual *\$5 Friday Films Festival* at 7pm every Friday night in January, and a Bushwalk to local Rock Art sites.
