Everyone respectfully joined in and participated following Mr Selwyn around the garden as he moved along the paths with the traditional smoking gum leaves. After the smoking ceremony all the guests and visitors were treated to a lovely picnic afternoon tea. This is a wonderful added space for our school where children can explore bush tucker plants growing and enjoy the tranquillity of nature in a restful shady and green space. It will be used as an outdoor learning space and environmental education learning tool. A huge thank you to Mrs Chloe Nebauer, our Early Intervention Aboriginal Teacher and to our wonderful General Assistant Macca for your work in making such a beautiful space. The school was able to make this happen by being fortunate enough to secure a small Eco Schools Grant of \$3,500. Please enjoy our lovely space.

Messages from the Office

Important Parking Message

The staff parking area inside the school gates on both Park Road and Bowden Road is for **Staff Use Only**. Parents dropping off and collecting their children from school, Music Bus or Cubbyhouse BASC are asked to park outside the school grounds and walk their children to and from their car. This is a Department of Education directive.

Office Hours

School phones are manned from 8.30am until 3.15pm. The office window is opened at 8.30am and closed at 3.00pm however office staff are available until 3.15pm. There is a teacher on duty at the bus lines until 3.20pm.

Changes to Going Home Arrangements

Could you please ensure that your child is aware of how they will be going home in the afternoon. If these arrangements change during the day it would be appreciated if you could contact the office prior to 2.00pm to ensure that the message is passed on to your child.

Skoolbag APP and Website

You can download the WWPS Skoolbag APP to both iPhone and Android devices. Event updates and important information will be sent out via our Skoolbag APP and you can record your child's absence from school here as well. You will also find our School website at http://www.woywoy-p.schools.nsw.edu.au/ which is regularly updated with events happening in our school. Student Mobile Phones

Students who bring their mobile phone to school are asked to leave them at the office on their arrival and collect it at the end of the school day. Students are not permitted to have their phone with them during the day. It is also helpful if their name is on their phone.

Late Arrival / Early Departure

If your child is late arriving to school or needs to leave early for an appointment, a partial absence slip is to be collected from the school office prior to going to your child's classroom. This slip is given to the classroom teacher.

Payment of Money to the School

School fees and activity costs can be paid by credit card via the Woy Woy Public School website (http://www.woywoy-p.schools.nsw.edu.au/) using the 'Make a Payment' tab. If you are making a cash payment please place the money in an envelope with the child's name, class and the reason clearly noted. We have cash collection envelopes at the school office for your use. All money is to be given to your child's teacher. When making payments for multiple children, separate money and envelopes for each child is appreciated, as it is very time-consuming to sort out at the time of receipting.

Refund, Exchange & Returns Policy

The Uniform Shop will accept returns and provide customers with an exchange, refund or repair where the customer can provide adequate proof of purchase by way of receipt and the following terms and conditions are followed:

- Exchanges can only be made within 14 days of purchase.
- No refund will be given for an incorrect size choice only an exchange and the item must have original tag and have not been washed and is in an "as new" condition.
- All faulty items need to be reviewed by the manufacturer before a decision is made regarding refund, repair or exchange.
- Any item to be reviewed by the manufacturer needs to be returned in a clean and freshly laundered condition.
- The Uniform Shop will not hand out replacement items until the manufacturer has decided on repair, refund or exchange.
 This process may take several weeks.
- All decisions will be notified to the customer.
- The Uniform Shop reserves the right not to offer an exchange, refund or repair on items where the item fault is the result
 of misuse, neglect or incorrect washing instructions of the item.
- The Uniform Shop reserves the right to assess the condition and age of returned goods prior to providing a repair, refund



Mini-MasterChefs cook up a storm

Aspiring mini-master chefs from Woy Woy Public School have shown off their cooking skills in the kitchen, showcasing a variety of dishes created to impress a panel of teacher-judges.

Member for Gosford, Ms Liesl Tesch MP featured as a guest judge and got to sample the delicious dishes and had the difficult task of determining the best cooked dish.

Judges had to consider three elements when assessing the students' dishes: flavour of the dish, the technique that went into making the dish, and the overall finished presentation.

Ms Tesch found it a challenging process with all dishes prepared spectacularly and tasted sublime.

"The students had created such delicious meals and desserts that I had to remind myself that they were made by primary school students. My favourite dish was the cherry-ripe chocolate brownies but this just narrowly beat the potato bake".

"It was great to see students learning such important life skills at school and being shown the steps to create their own meals instead of relying on pre-made or nutrient-low frozen meals."

Coordinating teacher, Ms Lina Williamson, spoke about the hard work and determination that students put in to create their dishes.

"Students work in teams to create their dishes so a lot of 21st century skills like problemsolving, collaboration and effective communication are demonstrated by the students".

"At the end of the day, it is about getting students excited about cooking and having fun in the kitchen, we want our students to know how to cook meals that are healthy and nutritious."

Woy Woy Public School is a participating school in the Stephanie Alexander Kitchen Garden Program which educates students about positive food habits, through fun and hands-on learning.

Students are taught how to grow vegetables and fruits in the school garden and approaches to maintaining and harvesting produce.

Students from years 3-6 are then given the opportunity to cook, using the produce that has been grown in the school garden over the last six years, to create and prepare healthy and nutritious meals.




Other times when you must not stop

You must not stop your vehicle (that is, bring it to a stop and either stay with the vehicle or leave it parked) in the following circumstances:

- Double parked (that is in the road alongside a car that is parked)
- Across a driveway or footpath
- On a median strip or traffic island
 - On footpaths and nature strips
- On or within 20 metres before and 10 metres after a children's crossing or pedestrian crossing



- Within an intersection
- Within 10 metres of an intersecting road at an intersection without traffic lights unless signposted otherwise **X X**



- In Bus Stop, Bus Zone, Taxi Stand or Taxi Zone signed areas **X X**
- At least one metre from any other parked vehicle, close as possible and parallel to the kerb, and facing the same direction as the traffic lane



- Within three metres of any double centre lines 異異

Traffic and Parking around your School

Parking rules are designed to stop vehicles from parking where it would be dangerous or inconvenient for others. Please consider the residents when parking in streets surrounding your school.
