## From the Principal

### Enrolments for 2020

There is only a term and a half left of the 2019 school year. Plans for 2020 school numbers and organisation around total student enrolments need to be considered well before we start the school year for 2020 in January. Enrolments for our Preschool and Kindergarten 2020 are slowly coming in.

**Preschool 2020:** The first selection process for our Preschool enrolments has been done and letters are going out to families now. There are still some places left for both the Seahorse and the Pelican groups. Our school can take 40 student enrolments for our Preschool on a rotational fortnight sessional basis. If someone you know would like the opportunity to have their child enrolled in our Preschool, please let them know spaces are now limited. Our Preschool has a rating of Exceeding in all National Quality Areas which we are very proud of and is a wonderful place full of discovery learning waiting to happen.

**Kindergarten 2020:** Already this term we have had two information sessions for parents who wish to enrol their child here at our school. Open Kindergarten classrooms saw a good attendance of parents getting a first-hand view of what learning really looks like in a Kindergarten classroom. Another Parent Information session is coming up on Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup> September 2019, starting at 6pm in our school hall. We feel it is really important here at Woy Woy Public School for our parents to have as much information about what will happen for their child when they first attend "big" school.

We start our Kindergarten Transition Program in Term 4 on the 23<sup>rd</sup> October, running every Wednesday over a four week period. This is an extremely important orientation for every child who is going to start school as it gives them the experience of what the school is like physically and to be able to become familiar with routines and the classroom environment. It helps to smooth the path to allow a gentle and happy beginning to their school educational journey.

Once again please get an enrolment form completed and handed into the school for your child if they are starting Kindergarten in 2020. If you know someone who has a child ready to start school in 2020 let them know it is time to enrol. We do not want any child to miss out on the wonderful transition to school process we offer here at Woy Woy Public School.

A big congratulations to Mrs Sandra Tuthill who has been made a permanent member of our School Office staff replacing Mrs Melinda Berg. Mrs Berg was taking some well deserved long service leave leading into retirement. We wish her well as she begins a new chapter of her life enjoying her grandchildren and doing some very exciting travels. We thank her for all of her dedicated work here at Woy Woy Public School over many years.

Mrs Berg certainly touched the lives of many children and community members alike with her caring and efficient manner. Enjoy your time now Mrs Berg.

## **Our school is looking to the future**

We are in a world of constant evolving change. Children of today live with artificial intelligence as part of their world and embrace technological advancements with ease. The way we teach children is evolving too. We cannot do what we have always done. The connected world demands creative, critical and analytical thinking in order to be part of a futuristic world. Jobs of today will be gone tomorrow. Communication has evolved and as we say, the world is at our fingertips.

Our school staff have had many discussions on how to make our school more innovative in our approach to 21<sup>st</sup> century learning. Changes are being considered for 2020 to benefit students and connect more to the world they are now in, and will be in the future as workers and perhaps leaders. We are considering a different teaching approach to bring change across Kindergarten to Year 2 and then a varied approach across Stage 2 and 3. Our Preschool is already aligned to discovery 'play based' which promotes problem solving, creative and critical thinking and has a rating of Exceeding in all National Standards. We have many classes adopting a flexible approach to classroom spaces and furniture, and this is showing very positive results for student learning.

Mrs Michelle Williams has been researching further on how our school could move into placing more emphasis on play-based learning and has put together the following brief for your information:

### **"Student-centred learning at Woy Woy Public School**

With the department's Future-focused learning and teaching initiative in mind, staff at Woy Woy Public School have been working towards embedding individualised, interest-based learning at the core of our programs. Our journey towards inquiry-based or 'Play based' learning will begin next year when all teachers Kindergarten to Year 2 will initiate an investigative learning program that aligns with NSW outcomes. Research has shown that 'Play-based' or investigative learning environments ease the transition to school for Kindergarten students, since the learning environment is not such a big jump from the preschool. It allows for increased opportunities for the practical, daily application of contemporary learning skills (communication, collaboration, creative and critical thinking). The inquiry-based nature of play is supported through the social interactions of teachers and children. Teachers will use children's motivation and interests to explore concepts and ideas. In this way, children acquire and practice important academic skills and learning in a playful context. Investigative learning starts with the students. Teachers build a profile of each student's strengths, background and readiness.

The traditional classroom set up of a desk for each student is replaced with 'stations' – construction, sensory play, STEM, writing, numeracy or any topic that aligns with our current program. Stations display 'provocations' – activities or materials that invite students to engage in a learning activity. Play based learning is purposeful. Teachers carefully and deliberately plan play-based experiences to help students learn in a way that is meaningful and enjoyable.

Research shows play-based programs for children in the early years of school can provide a strong basis for later success. Our Kindergarten to Year 2 teachers are excited to promote this learning model and welcome you to visit their innovative learning environments"

Next newsletter will have some more information about what changes may occur for Stage 2 and 3. Exciting times ahead for our school as we strive to work towards connecting more successfully with our 21<sup>st</sup> century students and their learning needs to ensure their success in a future world.

## Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) Weeks 5, 6, 7 & 8

For the past fortnight, teachers have been teaching their students about how to 'Be Cooperative' when playing games with their peers during class time or at break times. Lessons have focused on the importance of taking turns so that everyone playing the game has an equal opportunity to get involved, and playing by the rules set down for each particular game so that everyone feels like they've had a fair go. More generally, teachers have taken the opportunity to discuss the concepts of 'fair play' and 'good sportsmanship'.

The PBL Focus behaviour for the next two weeks is telling the truth (from the 'Be Responsible' set of expectations). Students will discuss the potential ramifications of 'telling tales' i.e. making disclosures that are untrue or making up rumours about people that have no basis in fact.

Students who successfully demonstrate honesty and sportsmanship will be rewarded with Win Bin tickets and stars on their Star Charts.

Parents and carers are encouraged to discuss PBL expectations with their children. If you have any questions related to the school's PBL program or about student wellbeing policies and practices, please direct them to either myself or Ms Buckley.

# Messages from the Office

## Important Parking Message

The staff parking area inside the school gates on both Park Road and Bowden Road is for **Staff Use Only**. Parents dropping off and collecting their children from school, Music Bus or Cubbyhouse BASC are asked to park outside the school grounds and walk their children to and from their car. This is a Department of Education directive.

## Office Hours

School phones are manned from 8.30am until 3.15pm. The office window is opened at 8.30am and closed at 3.00pm however office staff are available until 3.15pm. There is a teacher on duty at the bus lines until 3.20pm.

## Changes to Going Home Arrangements

Could you please ensure that your child is aware of how they will be going home in the afternoon. If these arrangements change during the day it would be appreciated if you could contact the office prior to 2.00pm to ensure that the message is passed on to your child.

## Skoolbag APP and Website

You can download the WWPS Skoolbag APP to both iPhone and Android devices. Event updates and important information will be sent out via our Skoolbag APP and you can record your child's absence from school here as well. ## Student Mobile Phones

Students who bring their mobile phone to school are asked to leave them at the office on their arrival and collect it at the end of the school day. Students are not permitted to have their phone with them during the day. It is also helpful if their name is on their phone.

## Late Arrival / Early Departure

If your child is late arriving to school or needs to leave early for an appointment, a partial absence slip is to be collected from the school office prior to going to your child's classroom. This slip is given to the classroom teacher.

## Payment of Money to the School

School fees and activity costs can be paid by credit card via the Woy Woy Public School website (<http://www.woywoy-p.schools.nsw.edu.au/>) using the 'Make a Payment' tab. If you are making a cash payment please place the money in an envelope with the child's name, class and the reason clearly noted. We have cash collection envelopes at the school office for your use. All money is to be given to your child's teacher. When making payments for multiple children, separate money and envelopes for each child is appreciated, as it is very time-consuming to sort out at the time of receipting.
