

From the Principal

Term 2 Week 10

This week marks the end of a very busy and productive term for the students of Woy Woy Public School, and what better note to finish on than the amazing NAIDOC Week celebration we hosted yesterday. Our students distinguished themselves by displaying excellent behaviour on the day, as they have done all term. Teachers have also been working hard marking assessments, analysing data, preparing academic reports for their students and conducting three-way conferences with students and parents. It's time for a well-earned rest for all members of the school community!

NAIDOC Week Celebrations

With 2019 being celebrated as the United Nations International Year of Indigenous Languages, this year's NAIDOC Week celebration was all about giving voice to words that connect our indigenous people to country, to an understanding of country and to a people who are the oldest continuing culture on the planet. The theme 'Voice. Treaty. Truth.' references the three key elements of the 'Uluru Statement from the Heart'; a truly inspirational text that identifies the need for a set of reforms that represent the unified position of First Nations Australians.

On Wednesday we were fortunate to have been visited again by the amazing Aunties from the Mingaletta Aboriginal & Torres Strait Island Corporation, along with bush tucker guru Mr Jake Cassar, Aboriginal artefacts and stories expert Uncle Tim, and Kristie Waters, a proud Wiradjuri woman, who was able to pass on some Wiradjuri language to our students. Mrs Nebauer has included a full run down of the events of yesterday, so be sure to read about the many and varied learning experiences and celebratory activities she organised for the day. I won't steal her thunder but I would like to re-iterate how proud we are and how priveledged we feel to have been able to establish the relationship that we have with our Aunties from Mingaletta. We are incredibly grateful for everything that they have done and continue to do for us. I'd also like to thank Mrs Nebauer, Mrs Williams and all of their helpers for their efforts in organising our NAIDOC Week assembly and the performances and activities that were on offer. I can't imagine a more authentic and successful community celebration for NAIDOC Week. Well done everyone!

Dance Programs

Enrolling for 2020

I wrote about the Woy Woy Public School 'Coming Up to Big School' (CUBS) Kindergarten orientation program in the last edition of the Namalata. The first of the Principal's Tours and Open Classroom sessions have been conducted and the program is off to a strong start. Next term sees us conducting Parent Information sessions in the preschool at 3pm on Wednesday 24th July and again on Wednesday 31st July. These are principally for parents of children who currently attend the Guliyali Preschool, however anyone who's interested in enrolling their child at WWPS next year can attend. There's an additional evening Parent Information session set down for Tuesday 3rd September for parents whose work commitments preclude them from attending the daytime sessions. Once again, all are welcome to attend. Postcards and brochures advertising important Kindergarten Transition events are available in the school office from the beginning of next week.

If you know of anyone who would be interested obtaining a postcard or brochure feel free to take one for them or to pass this information on to them. Enrolments for both Kindergarten and for the Guliyali Preschool for 2020 are now open. The WWPS Guliyali Preschool was rated 'Exceeding' in all seven Quality Areas of the National Quality Standard last year by ACEQCA. Places are filling up fast for 2020 so please contact the office as soon as possible if you wish for your son/daughter to attend our preschool next year.

Staff Development Day – Term 3 2018

Term 3 will start with a School Development Day on Monday 22nd July 2019. This is a pupil free day. The first day of school for all students for Term 3 is Tuesday 23rd July.

On the Monday, our staff will attend the annual Brisbane Water Learning Community School development Day, giving them the opportunity to liaise with colleagues from other partner primary schools and high schools and to participate in professional learning tailored to their own specific needs. The keynote speaker this year is Jill Sweatman, a 'Neuroscience Strategist in Learning and Development', who'll be presenting on 'The Impact of Devices, Distractions & Diet in the Classroom'. Jill will be reviewing the latest research on the impact that excessive use of technology and gaming has on young brains in their formative years.

On a related note, the school has spoken with a number of students and parents about inappropriate cyber interactions on websites such as Instagram and Facebook, and when gaming on Play Stations and the like. We strongly recommend that if you decide allow your child to access and use these forums, you encourage them to report any negative comments they receive to you, or better still, that you regularly monitor their interactions. We are increasingly finding children of primary school age don't have the requisite life experience to enable them to deal appropriately with conflicts that arise on social media platforms.

Before we part ways for the holiday break, I'd like to take the opportunity to thank all of our parents, carers and community members for their involvement and for their support of what we try to achieve here at WWPS. Student Mobile Phones

Students who bring their mobile phone to school are asked to leave them at the office on their arrival and collect it at the end of the school day. Students are not permitted to have their phone with them during the day. It is also helpful if their name is on their phone.

Late Arrival / Early Departure

If your child is late arriving to school or needs to leave early for an appointment, a partial absence slip is to be collected from the school office prior to going to your child's classroom. This slip is given to the classroom teacher.

Payment of Money to the School

School fees and activity costs can be paid by credit card via the Woy Woy Public School website (http://www.woywoy-p.schools.nsw.edu.au/) using the 'Make a Payment' tab. If you are making a cash payment please place the money in an envelope with the child's name, class and the reason clearly noted. We have cash collection envelopes at the school office for your use. All money is to be given to your child's teacher. When making payments for multiple children, separate money and envelopes for each child is appreciated, as it is very time-consuming to sort out at the time of receipting.

Refund, Exchange & Returns Policy

The Uniform Shop will accept returns and provide customers with an exchange, refund or repair where the customer can provide adequate proof of purchase by way of receipt and the following terms and conditions are followed:

- Exchanges can only be made within 14 days of purchase.
- No refund will be given for an incorrect size choice only an exchange and the item must have original tag and have not been washed and is in an "as new" condition.
- All faulty items need to be reviewed by the manufacturer before a decision is made regarding refund, repair or exchange.

- The Uniform Shop reserves the right to assess the condition and age of returned goods prior to providing a repair, refund





Other times when you must not stop

You must not stop your vehicle (that is, bring it to a stop and either stay with the vehicle or leave it parked) in the following drcumstances:

- Double parked (that is in the road alongside a car that is parked) XX
 - Across a driveway or footpath
- On a median strip or traffic island On footpaths and nature strips XXX
- On or within 20 metres before and 10 metres after a children's crossing or pedestrian crossing



- Within an intersection 8
- Within 10 metres of an intersecting road at an intersection without traffic lights unless signposted otherwise 8



- In Bus Stop, Bus Zone, Taxi Stand or Taxi Zone signed areas 8 8
- At least one metre from any other parked vehicle, close as possible and parallel to the kerb, and facing the same direction as the traffic lane

Traffic and Parking around your School

Parking rules are designed to stop vehicles from parking where it would be dangerous or inconvenient for others. Please consider the residents when parking in streets surrounding your school.

The school zone speed limit only applies on gazetted school days and during the times A School Zone is the area around a school with a speed limit of 40 km/h. Between the School Zone and End School Zone signs you must obey the school zone speed limit. shown on the sign. 5
