## From the Principal

## Term 2 Week 8

It's getting close to the end of term but there are still a lot of exciting experiences and community events happening here at Woy Woy Public School.

### **P & C Disco**

This week saw the P & C host their first daytime disco. The disco was conducted in this way to trial the daytime format, as a way of addressing the decline in the number of children attending winter discos held outside of school hours. A survey is being produced by the P & C in order to allow parents to have their say on whether they felt that the event was successful or not, and to establish whether the idea of a daytime disco has merit as far as parents and carers are concerned. It will be interesting to see what sort of feedback is received. The disco was certainly well attended and from the school's perspective there was a minimum of disruption to learning on the day.

I'd like to thank the members of the P & C for volunteering to organise this event and I'd like to acknowledge the hard work of the P & C Fundraising Committee, who have come up with some very innovative ideas for raising money to fund educational initiatives for our students. Your efforts are much appreciated.

### **Mrs Williamson and Mr Smith to Host University of Newcastle Students**

We are justifiably proud of our Stephanie Alexander Kitchen Garden (SAKG) program here at Woy Woy PS, and it appears our program is very highly regarded over at the University of Newcastle (UON) as well. We've hosted students who are undertaking the UON's Sustainability course for pre-service teachers for three years now, and have been voted the highlight of their 'Sustainability Visits Week' for each of those three years. UON students will again be visiting the school next week and Mrs Williamson and Mr Smith will take them on a guided tour of our SAKG facilities, run them through our sustainability education program and treat them to a meal that has been lovingly prepared by students here at the school, from produce largely grown and harvested on-site. This ongoing relationship is an excellent example of the school garnering recognition for its progressive educational programs in the wider community, and we are very proud of the connection we have been able to establish with UON.

### **NAIDOC Week Celebrations and the WWPS Bush Tucker Garden**

In the pages that follow this message, you'll be able to read about the transformation that is taking place in our front garden. Under the guidance of Mrs Nebauer, our students are establishing a Bush Tucker Garden, while Macca has been busy building plant beds, creating educational spaces and tidying the whole area. ### **Kindergarten Orientation for the 2020 Student Intake**

The WWPS 'Coming Up to Big School' (CUBS) Kindergarten orientation program begins this term with a Principal's Tour of the school at 9:00am on Friday 28<sup>th</sup> June and Kindergarten 'Open Classrooms' in Week 10 on Friday the 4<sup>th</sup> July.

Additional Principal's Tours and Open Classrooms sessions have been scheduled for early next term, and we will also be hosting two afternoon information sessions in Weeks 1 and 2 of Term 3. The traditional evening Parent Information Session has been scheduled for 6pm on Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup> September. Postcards and brochures advertising these dates will be available in the office from the beginning of next week. If you know of anyone who would be interested obtaining a postcard or brochure free to take one for them or to pass this information on to them.

Enrolments for Kindergarten in 2020 are now open. Enrolment forms can be obtained from the office.

### **Student Academic Reports**

Student Academic Reports will be going home at the end of this week. When reading and signing the reports I was struck by the wide array of enrichment opportunities and extra-curricular programs on offer for students here at WWPS. In the first semester of this year, students from Kindergarten through to Year 6 have participated in Debating and Public Speaking competitions, Choir and Dance groups, Chess and Robotics clubs, representative sports teams, the Student Representative Council (SRC), and ANZAC Day marches, Easter Hat Parades and visits to the Deepwater Court Retirement Village. Each of these initiatives presents a wonderful opportunity for students to extend themselves in fields that are of interest to them.

As far as the reports themselves are concerned, teachers have spent a great deal of time collating assessment data and evaluating the progress of each of the students in their class, in order to produce accurate, informative reports for parents/carers. As has been mentioned in previous editions of the Namalata, this year teachers have made themselves available before and after school, and in some cases during their Release from Face-to-Face (RFF) time, to conduct three-way conferences and/or parent-teacher interviews. I'd like to thank our staff members for their commitment to improving communication around the assessment and reporting process and for giving up their time to allow these meetings to happen.

### **Code of Conduct for Parents, Carers and Visitors**

The Woy Woy Public School Code of Conduct for Parents, Carers and Visitors is designed to ensure that everyone who visits the school site is able to do so in a safe and harmonious manner and that students, staff, parents, carers and other visitors are not subjected to aggressive, hostile or violent behaviours. The document (which is attached to the email containing to this edition of the Namalata) sets out the standards of behaviour expected of those who visit the school. In particular, the document states that all parents, carers and visitors are expected to treat all persons associated with the school with respect and courtesy. The code also stipulates that any issues or concerns about the school, staff, other parents or students be raised via the correct school procedures.

To quote directly from the document: “Your co-operation is sought and greatly appreciated, so that we all maintain a safe, harmonious and happy learning environment for every student, parent and staff member at Woy Woy Public School.”

### Student Illnesses

We have had a number of students coming to school over the past few weeks with respiratory infections and ‘gastro’ bugs. 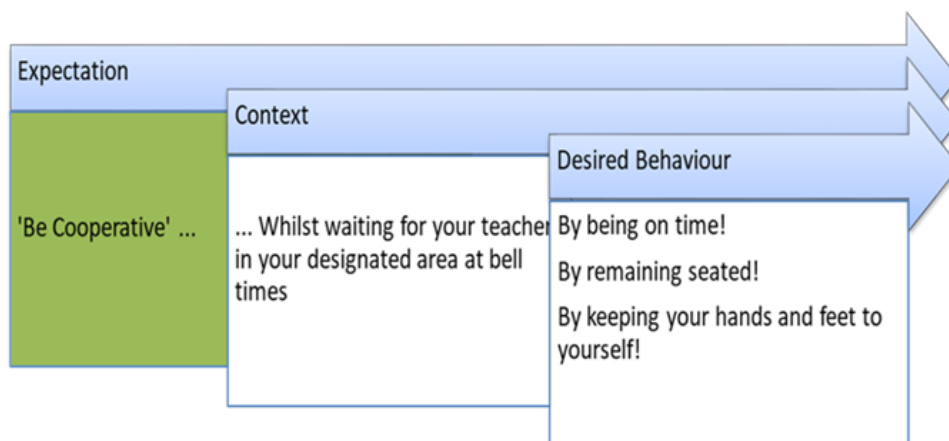

## Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) Weeks 9 & 10

## National Consistent Collection of Data

Every year, all schools participate in the National Consistent Collection of Data (NCCD). The school is required to report on the number of students enrolled who have a disability or needs of a physical, sensory, cognitive or social/emotional nature. We are then required to indicate whether the student is receiving assistance at a ‘supplementary, substantial or extensive’ level. This data is collated and provides the school with evidence of the needs of students at Woy Woy Public School.

Learning and Support Teachers (LaST) and School Learning and Support Officers (SLSO) run supplementary programs for students requiring support with literacy, numeracy, social skill and behaviour programs. These programs are provided within the classroom, in the LaST classroom or on the playground depending on the level of need.

The information assists schools to:

- formally recognise the supports and adjustments provided to students with disability, academic, social and behaviour needs in schools.
- consider how they can strengthen the support for the students.
- develop shared practices so that they can review their programs to improve the outcomes for students.

The NCCD provides State and Federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students.

The NCCD will have no direct impact on the students and the students will not be involved in any testing process.

Substantial adjustments are provided to students in our six Special Education classes as their education, behaviour and social development is based on Individual Education Programs. Students are required to have been supported for 10 weeks over the previous 12 months to be entered onto the database. If you have any further questions about the NCCD, please contact the school.

Students are able to access their personal reading log online, by logging into the PRC 2019 site with their school username and password. Once they have read 20 books and entered them online (or filled out the paper log at school), Mrs Walker will validate their record so students will receive their certificate at the end of the year. All K-2 students and students in the Disabilities Classes will automatically complete this challenge with teachers reading stories to their classes, however, students in years 3-6 need to read 20 books independently and fill out the reading log to complete this challenge. # Messages from the Office

## Important Parking Message

The staff parking area inside the school gates on both Park Road and Bowden Road is for **Staff Use Only**. Parents dropping off and collecting their children from school, Music Bus or Cubbyhouse BASC are asked to park outside the school grounds and walk their children to and from their car. This is a Department of Education directive.

## Office Hours

School phones are manned from 8.30am until 3.15pm. The office window is opened at 8.30am and closed at 3.00pm however office staff are available until 3.15pm. There is a teacher on duty at the bus lines until 3.20pm.

## Changes to Going Home Arrangements

Could you please ensure that your child is aware of how they will be going home in the afternoon. If these arrangements change during the day it would be appreciated if you could contact the office prior to 2.00pm to ensure that the message is passed on to your child.

## Skoolbag APP and Website

You can download the WWPS Skoolbag APP to both iPhone and Android devices. Event updates and important information will be sent out via our Skoolbag APP and you can record your child's absence from school here as well. ## Student Mobile Phones

Students who bring their mobile phone to school are asked to leave them at the office on their arrival and collect it at the end of the school day. Students are not permitted to have their phone with them during the day. It is also helpful if their name is on their phone.

## Late Arrival / Early Departure

If your child is late arriving to school or needs to leave early for an appointment, a partial absence slip is to be collected from the school office prior to going to your child's classroom. This slip is given to the classroom teacher.

## Payment of Money to the School

School fees and activity costs can be paid by credit card via the Woy Woy Public School website (<http://www.woywoy-p.schools.nsw.edu.au/>) using the 'Make a Payment' tab. If you are making a cash payment please place the money in an envelope with the child's name, class and the reason clearly noted. We have cash collection envelopes at the school office for your use. All money is to be given to your child's teacher. When making payments for multiple children, separate money and envelopes for each child is appreciated, as it is very time-consuming to sort out at the time of receipting.

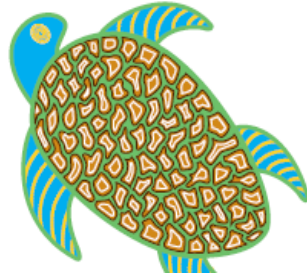

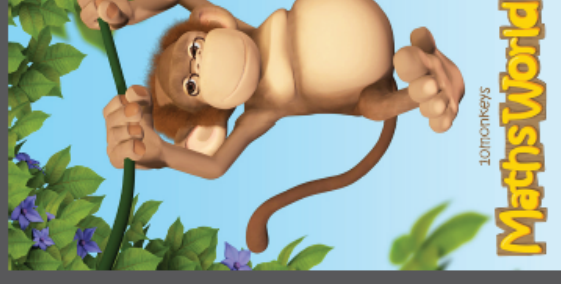
