### From the Principal

### Term 4 Week 4

Well here we are four weeks into the last term of the school year. It would seem the weather is being just as unpredictable as the 2020 year we have been having. Hot one day, raining and cold the next. A little reminder about naming items of clothing as students discard jackets on days when the weather starts off cold and heats up. Hats seem to be a problem too. Name tagging definitely helps us find the owners of missing items. There is a huge amount of good uniform clothing items in lost property at present. One of our P&C members have volunteered to check through this and sort out and return items with names but please encourage your child to look through lost property as well.

Time is moving quickly and are already well into writing Semester 2 reports for our students and planning end of year presentations and activities. New COVID-19 updates have been released from the Department of Education for schools and some restrictions have been relaxed around end of year planned activities. A positive outcome for everyone, but still we must be ever mindful of COVID safe requirements. Please find information on these updates with this newsletter.

### Thanks for your input!

We had our best response rate in recent memory, by some considerable margin, when we asked parents to complete this year's Tell Them From Me surveys. A huge thank you goes out to the 70 parents who took the time to take the survey. We're collecting and analysing the data obtained and compiling reports based on the responses we obtained. The feedback you've given us will be instrumental in helping us to identify emerging issues and plan for improvement when writing the school's Strategic Improvement Plan for 2021 – 2024.

### Sharing our expertise in Play-based Learning

On Wednesday 4<sup>th</sup> November we hosted a visit of Early Stage 1 teachers from Tacoma Public School. After featuring on the State wide Staffroom with a presentation about our play based pedagogy, we have had a number of schools booking in visits to come and see first-hand how we run our program. This showcasing of what we do is a great promotion for our school. Thank you to Michelle Young, Michelle Williams, the Preschool team and teachers across K-2 for your committed and dedicated work around this very innovative approach to improving learning outcomes for our children.

### Have you enrolled your child for Preschool or Kindergarten 2021?

With Kindergarten transition about to begin it is a timely reminder to make sure your child is enrolled. Children cannot be part of the transition program unless they have approached the school and filed an enrolment form. Children are eligible to start Kindergarten in 2021 if they turn 5 before the 31<sup>st</sup> July that year. Please feel welcome to have a conversation with our staff if you are unsure about your child's readiness to start school.

Preschool children need to be in the year before school and must have turned 4 before July 31<sup>st</sup>, 2021. There are limited places available now in our Preschool for 2021 so please contact the school for more information.

### Preschool and Kindergarten information evening

An information session for parents of Preschool and Kindergarten children enrolling for 2021 has been arranged for Thursday 26<sup>th</sup> November. A COVID Safe venue has been booked where all COVID Safe practices will be in place. The evening will be held at Everglades Club on Dunban Road Woy Woy. The Preschool information session will run from 5:30pm to 6:15pm. Information will be shared about our preschool and what your child will experience in their preschool year. At the end of this session, the venue will be cleaned and made ready for the Kindergarten parents and carers information session starting at 6:30, and going to approximately 7:15pm. Information will be shared on what your child will experience in Kindergarten, school routines and rules, equipment and other requirements, and ways in which you can support your child during their Kindergarten year. How exciting to welcome another group of families to our school as your children start their educational journey at Guliyali Preschool and Woy Woy Public School.

### Year 5 Zoo Snooze excursion deposit refunds

All parents who paid the deposit for the Year 5 Zoo Snooze excursion will be refunded this money over the next few weeks. Forms for parents to complete sign and send back to school are being sent out next week. Once they are returned the process to refund the money by paying back into personal bank accounts will begin. Thank you for your patience with this as we all waited to see what may have been possible in COVID conditions.

### Repeat message for a reminder: 2021 School Structure

It is that time of year again when our school starts forward planning for the school structure for the next year. How we structure classes for 2021 will depend on the total number of students enrolled for 2021, the staffing entitlement the Department of Education allocates and numbers in each grade year. As always teachers are in the best professional position to make the decision about where a child should be placed for the optimum possible benefit of their educational progress. We know that children grow and change as they progress through school. They change socially and their associations with other children change. Academically they may need support or challenge. As always it is important to remember that students are placed in classes to enhance their learning opportunities with sound teacher professional knowledge backed up with assessment, work task results and classroom teacher observation expertise on the educational, social and emotional growth of a child. We do welcome your input in this process if you believe there are extenuating circumstances that need to be considered when placing your child in a class for 2021. If you would like the opportunity to have these extenuating circumstances considered, please put your concerns in writing and address the correspondence to the Principal. Please always remember this process is totally confidential. All these requests will be taken into consideration but we cannot guarantee that it will be possible to fulfil these requests, as numbers, teachers available and professional educational judgement will determine the final outcome. Please ensure we have all of these concerns by the 20th November 2020. Classes will be formed at the end of the year for 2021 but as always may not be set until the beginning of 2021 when numbers of students on seats become apparent. Thank you for your continued support with this annual process.

Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) is a whole-school framework that promotes positive behaviour across our school. Every five weeks a team of teachers including the school Principal, executive staff and representatives from each stage analyse our school behavioural data. The results of this analysis leads our whole school implementation of Positive Behaviour for Learning.

This fortnight teachers have been talking to students about how to 'Be Proud' especially when representing the school in the community. Lessons have had a focus on being proud of our school by wearing the appropriate school uniform.

Research tells us that the effectiveness of wellbeing programs are increased when schools and families work together. Holding conversations with your child/children about the fortnightly whole school PBL message will ensure that they have a good understanding of the school expectations and provide them with added strategies to demonstrate positive behaviours. The focus for the next fortnight will be "Be Responsible" when using devices.

If however, you do not feel comfortable completing an application online, a paper copy will be available for collection from the front office or can be downloaded from the Department's going to a public school site.

All students should be at school unless:

- they have a medical certificate which states that they are unable to return to school due to an ongoing medical condition



### Guliyali Preschool News



It is our role as educators to play an active role in providing opportunities for children to feel safe in the setting they are moving to by helping them understand the process and be comfortable with the change. This week we have supported the children in knowing where and how to purchase something from the WWPS Snack Shack. Prior to visiting the Snack Shack, the children had the opportunity to practice the necessary skills of lining up, asking for what they would like in a big clear voice, and using their manners in the preschool environment, where we transformed the dramatic play space from a kitchen to a faux canteen/café.

"Transitions... Different places and spaces have their own purposes, expectations and ways of doing things. Building on children's prior and current experiences helps them feel secure, confident and connected to familiar people, places, events and understandings" (DEEWR, 2009, p.19).

Our preschool children have taken full advantage of the spring weather planting an assortment of fruits, vegetables and flowers in our garden. The children have been sowing seeds, planting seedlings, ensuring the beds are topped up with water and pulling weeds when needed. We plan on harvesting some of the foods before the end of term so the children can reap the rewards of all of their efforts in the garden. The project has been a wonderful learning opportunity for the children to learn about using authentic tools in the garden, trial and test out new ways of growing things, sustainability when using rainwater to water the gardens and promoting healthy food options. We are hoping our garden attracts some buzzing bees as this has been a huge topic of interest in the preschool as well. Fingers crossed!

















## School Travel for 2021



## 2021 school travel applications are now open

Applications for student travel in 2021 opened from Monday 12 October 2020.

Students who require a School Opal card or travel pass for 2021 can now <u>apply</u> online. A new application should be submitted if a student is applying for a school travel pass for the first time or requesting an additional pass as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation (e.g. joint custody).

Students who have changed school/campus, changed address, repeated a year or received an expiry notification from Transport for NSW for their school travel entitlement should re-apply or update their details.

"Applications must be completed by the student's parent or legal guardian if the student is aged under 16 years. Students 16 years and over must complete the application form themselves.

Where there is a change of distance eligibility based on a student's grade, the system will automatically update a student's entitlement if they meet the new criteria. If they do not meet the new eliqibility criteria, they will receive an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition which is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

If a student needs to update their information or re-apply, they should go online to https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails Applications need to be submitted before 31 December 2020 to ensure that current student entitlements are updated and their current entitlement/card remains valid. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2020, the system will automatically cancel an entitlement/card and a new one will need to be issued.

Students in the Opal network applying for a SSTS or Term Bus Pass entitlement for the first time will receive their card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2021

Students residing in Rural and Regional (R&R) areas should receive their travel pass at the commencement of the new school year from their nominated operator, this may be distributed via the school or sent direct to their address. Note: some R&R operators do not issue travel passes. Students/Parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

## New Concession Entitlement Cards

Transport for NSW will be replacing the below cards with Transport Concession Entitlement Cards (TCEC) from October 2020:

- Senior Secondary Student Concession Card (16 years and over) also used by Mature Secondary Students (18 years and over), Distance Education Students and Home School Students
- Proof of Age card (when a student under 16 years of age looks older)
  - Boarder Rail Pass.

All previous cards will be valid until they expire. Students who require a Transport Concession Entitlement Card should speak with their school administration staff.


