Our important visitors

On Thursday morning we were privileged to have a visit from Mr Tim McCallum, Executive Director of School Performance for the NSW Department of Education accompanied by Mr Chris Bice our Director Educational Leadership for the Brisbane Waters schools.



Mrs Buckley, Mr Betts, our beautiful Aboriginal Elder Aunties Robyn and Elaine and our School Leaders Lara, Cameron, Jasmine and Anwar proudly took our visitors on a tour of our much loved school. We started in our Kindergarten and Stage 1 flexible learning spaces, moved to our impressive Aboriginal Bush Tucker Garden, onto our exceeding Preschool, then to our six Special Needs and the Stage 2 and Stage 3 classrooms followed by The School as Community Centre, onto the Stephanie Alexander Kitchen Gardens and finishing in the Cooking Kitchen for a morning tea prepared by our students. As we visited each area our amazing Assistant Principals and teachers explained what we are doing here at Woy Woy Public School in all of our different and unique settings. Our very supportive P&C proudly gave a letter to Mr McCallum of support for our school, especially mentioning the new innovative changes that are in place this year and beyond.

One of Mr McCallum comments was that he could feel the community spirit, staff cohesion and support from everyone for our very complex school and especially the openness of our school to welcome and work together with our community

It was a very rewarding morning. One that reminds you of our vision here at Woy Woy Public School. "We challenge and support all students to achieve their personal best". We are inclusive of all students' needs and are constantly researching and implementing ways to reach all students to maximise their learning needs and encourage them to always do their best, to give it a go, find a way and to support them to achieve improved results, building towards a secure future.

Settling In

Over the last few weeks our students have been settling into their new classes, new routines and new teachers for 2020. It is fantastic to see how positive our school is and how engaged and happy our students are. Our new little Preschoolers have adjusted to their new environment and are happily engrossed in the interest play based world of our Preschool. They love to play, explore, design, make, experience, interact and discuss what they are doing with each other and their Educators. Such a wonderful way to learn. Our Kindergarten students are loving big school and are already doing their Language, Learning and Literacy lessons (L3) on their way to starting to read. It is most definitely a fun way to learn to read. Teachers on Kindergarten and Stage 1 classes are excited to be starting down the road to introducing more play based learning into the school day for our students. Plans for purchasing more equipment, furniture and learning activities are well on the way. Professional learning is being scheduled in for teachers to visit other schools trialling this new approach and to be able to have experts in this area to come in and work with them. Over the next 2 weeks you will have had the chance to attend information sessions on what is happening for your child in 2020. We are very excited about all the innovative changes we have implemented across our school for 2020. Feedback so far from parents, students and teachers has been extremely positive. Our new four break times spread across the school learning day are working well. Over the last few years we were registering a lot of playground incidents during the longer lunch break. In the first 2 weeks of Term 1 in 2019 a total of 79 playground incidents were recorded. In the same period this year only one very minor incident occurred. Makes for happy students, teachers and parents. We have also noticed students are more engaged during lesson sessions. All very welcome, positive outcomes.

Thank you everyone for your strong support with all that is going forward in 2020.

Teacher Professional Learning

In recognition of the fact that quality teaching is the single most influential factor in ensuring our students achieve all that they are capable of and more, Woy Woy Public School has put steps in place to ensure that every teacher has the opportunity to engage with high quality, focused, relevant professional learning that is tailored to their individual needs, while at the same time addressing school priorities. Next Tuesday all teaching staff are participating in a three hour AVID training session delivered by Dr Tracy Worthington (NSW AVID Education Coordinator) and Margaret O'Brien (an experienced AVID teacher from Woy Woy South PS). The following week, Ms McLean will be delivering a professional learning session on using the English as an Additional Language or Dialect (EAL/D) Progressions, with a view to incorporating the progressions into academic reports for EAL/D students. Sue will be joined by Emma Roncari, the EAL/D Teacher Mentor for the Central Coast, as co-presenter for the afternoon. The Wiping Out Waste team will be presenting a professional learning session to our staff later in the term, as follow-up to the waste audit they will conduct at the school in Week 8, and in Week 9 Mr Curran will deliver a 'Big Write & VCOP' training session to staff. (VCOP stands for Vocabulary, Connectives, Openers and Punctuation. Big Write & VCOP is an approach designed to raise the standards of writing across all ages and ability levels in Australasian schools, and we are very excited to be able to introduce the approach to our students).

Teacher Professional Learning sessions are scheduled every Tuesday afternoon from 3:10 – 4:30pm. In addition to the sessions outlined above, teachers will attend 'A', 'B' and 'C' Cycle Committee meetings on Tuesday afternoons this term, enabling the Literacy, Numeracy, History & Geography, STEM, PDHPE, Creative Arts, Student Wellbeing, Work Health and Safety, Information and Communications Technology (ICT), and Aboriginal Education teams to meet and plan initiatives to implement for the benefit of our students. All teachers choose which of the 'A', 'B' and 'C' cycle committees is most appropriate to their areas of expertise, and likewise, choose which of our seven Strategic Direction Teams most suits their interests. Strategic Directions Teams meet in Week 8 of this term to review our progress towards fulfilling the goals and milestones set out in our School Plan for 2018 – 2020.

On top of all of this our teachers have been busily completing yearly updates for staff training courses mandated by the NSW Department of Education, including Child Protection Training, Code of Conduct online training and Corruption Prevention for Public Schools eLearning. Our yearly face-to-face CPR training and Recognition and Management of Anaphylaxis (face-to-face) sessions are scheduled for Tuesday, 30th June.

Strategic Direction 1 in our School Plan for 2018 – 2020 lists "... A school culture which is professionally supportive, proactive and strengthens teacher capabilities exists within the school..." as a desired product or outcome. Hopefully, it is evident from the information provided above that the school is striving to deliver on this commitment.

Teachers and students have been discussing the importance of 'Being Cooperative' this fortnight. Through explicit lessons and activities we have reinforced the importance of working together to do things the first time. This coming week teachers will continue to talk about 'Being Cooperative' especially during eating times. We will be discussing the importance of sitting down while we eat, waiting for teacher instruction after eating time and the importance of staying in our designated areas until the eating bell has sounded. Woy Woy Public School takes a whole school approach to Positive Behaviour for Learning and your support is always very valued. Wellbeing across the school

Student wellbeing is a priority at Woy Woy Public School. Student resilience and wellbeing are essential for both academic and social development, and are optimised by safe, supportive and respectful learning environments. To ensure our students are well equipped to deal with the challenges life can sometimes provide us with we have implemented a number of Wellbeing Programs across the school.

TOP BLOKES



The Top Blokes program has commenced this year for selected Stage 3 boys and is designed to provide a social education program for boys aged between 10-13 years. The attending students will participate in an eight week program where they will develop key social and decision making skills.

SHINE Girl Program

Our School Chaplin, Aimee Campbell, will commence a mentoring program for Stage 3 girls. The SHINE Girl Program is designed to offer girls an opportunity to develop a strong sense of personal identity, confidence and hope. These sessions will run throughout Term 1.

Stronger, Braver, Wiser



In 2020 Woy Woy Public School has been fortunate enough to secure the services of Mr Grant Hickman of 'Focus Body and Soul'. The Stronger, Braver, Wiser program caters for all students K-6 and focusses on developing skills to make positive choices & increasing self-control.

Stage 2 Mentoring through Sports Program

Research shows that there are many ways of assisting students who need help to maximise their learning outcomes. One effective way of doing this is for teachers and other adults to work with students in small groups in coaching or mentoring roles. Last year our Stage 3 students were provided with opportunities to engage in small group sports mentoring sessions with Mr Peter Graham, this year we are offering the same opportunities to our Stage 2 students. Mr Greg Curran and Mr Graham will use sport to provide a context to develop strong relationships and develop leadership skills in our Stage 2 students.

Scripture and Ethics 2020

Scripture and Ethics lessons are scheduled to begin in week 5 (Wednesday, 26th February). Lessons for students in years 3-6 will be held each Wednesday between 9:00am and 9:30am. Lessons for students in years K-2 will be held each Wednesday between 9:30am and 10:00am.

Combined scripture teaches a general Christian message, Catholic scripture follows the teachings of the Catholic faith, Ethics classes focus on exploring moral issues, and non-scripture is for students whose parents don't wish them to attend any of the offered options. Students will be placed in the same class they attended last year unless parents request an alternate placement in writing. The school is currently able to provide ethics classes for students in Kindergarten and year 1. Notes for expressions of interest in ethics education will be sent home to students in other grades if more volunteer teachers become available. Student Mobile Phones

If your child is late arriving to school or needs to leave early for an appointment, a partial absence slip is to be collected from the school office prior to going to your child's classroom. This slip is given to the classroom teacher.

Refund, Exchange & Returns Policy

The Uniform Shop will accept returns and provide customers with an exchange, refund or repair where the customer can provide adequate proof of purchase by way of receipt and the following terms and conditions are followed:

- Exchanges can only be made within 14 days of purchase.
- No refund will be given for an incorrect size choice only an exchange and the item must have original tag and have not been washed and is in an "as new" condition.
- All faulty items need to be reviewed by the manufacturer before a decision is made regarding refund, repair or exchange.
- Any item to be reviewed by the manufacturer needs to be returned in a clean and freshly laundered condition.
- The Uniform Shop will not hand out replacement items until the manufacturer has decided on repair, refund or exchange. This process may take several weeks.
- All decisions will be notified to the customer.
- The Uniform Shop reserves the right not to offer an exchange, refund or repair on items where the item fault is the result
 of misuse, neglect or incorrect washing instructions of the item.
