A big thank you

Once again we want to let you know how much we appreciate your support and patience with how our school needs to operate during this time. We are so proud of everyone, staff, students and parents all working together to make our school a happy and safe place where learning can take place.

Restrictions being lifted

The Department of Education have provided us with an update of what restrictions can be lifted over the next couple of weeks till the end of Term 2 and what can be lifted in Term 3.

There are still some pending items that still need to be decided on such as day and overnight excursions. We have been able to book in excursions for all our stages so as to save the dates and let parents know costs and the activities that will occur for the students on these excursions. Students in Year 5 and 6 have made deposits to the Canberra and Zoo excursions which can be transferred to the Great Aussie Bush Camp if parents still wish their children to attend. We will know whether we can continue with these excursions in the near future and whether we can supplement these to bring down costs for everyone. Rumbalara excursions can go ahead from now as it is an Environmental Education Centre attached to the Department of Education.

Incursions such as having specialists in to talk about subjects of interest can be invited into the school at our discretion if we believe it will be beneficial to students and safe in the current climate. However we can now have the Music Bus operating on our site. We do not have an answer as to when parents will again be able to access school grounds but as you will see from the documentation things are slowly getting back to normal as we know it. Hang in there everyone and remember to be COVID safe.

Mr Brady's Archaeological dig

Mr Brady is ready and very excited to get down and dirty with the planned historical archaeological dig on the ground space which was under the demountable classroom that was recently removed. Safe boundaries have been marked on the site. A risk assessment has been completed and all is in readiness for the event. We have some very excited students ready to be able to take part in this "hands on" history in the making dig. We know this building sat on that site for more than 20 years or longer so who knows what will be found. The site has been checked carefully by the demolishers as well as Mr Brady to ensure all glass objects and sharp items have been removed and catalogued so our students will not be harmed. We asked some of the students what they thought they might find.





Here is what they thought of:

Isabelle 3/4A - I think we might find a lot of rubbish, some coins, lots of bug and insects as well as dead roots of an old tree.

Sophie 3/4A - I think we might find old newspaper articles, some old money, paper bags and lots more rubbish.

Edie 3/4LB - We might find old food wrappers, buckets, old equipment, parts that might have fallen off the building and plastic from frozen juice cups from the Canteen

It will be very interesting to see what is actually found but the archaeological process the students will go through will be invaluable and the experience of a lifetime. More updates to come as the works progress.

Our Kiss and Drop zone must be used correctly at all times.


Kiss and Ride Zones are designed for your convenience and for your child's safety. Designed for quick entry and exit, these zones minimise congestion and risk when used properly by all parents and carers. These zones operate under the same conditions as no parking zones, which means you may stop to drop off or pick up children for a maximum of 2 minutes. You're required to remain in, or within 3 metres of, your vehicle.

Fines can be applied and we do hope that this will not be the case if we all do the right thing.

Keep safe and have a happy couple of weeks ahead as things start returning to normality.

New Online Enrolment System

Online enrolment for new students is now available at our school! If your child lives within the local area and is an Australian or New Zealand citizen and wishes to enrol at our school, you can enrol them through our school website under the 'Enrolment' tab.

The Online Enrolment System is designed to provide flexibility for parents to submit an Application to enrol in a NSW Government School online at the time that best suits you. The application can be accessed on all browsers and mobile devices including iOS and Android.

The online application process is currently restricted to:

- Enrolments into local schools only
- Children who are Australian citizens, New Zealand citizens or permanent residents
- Children who live in NSW

We offer our support and encourage you to complete your application to enrol online. If however, you do not feel comfortable completing an application online, a paper copy will be available for collection from the front office or can be downloaded from the Department's going to a public school site.

Important Attendance Information



All students should be at school unless:

- they have a medical certificate which states that they are unable to return to school due to an ongoing medical condition
- they are currently unwell.

If your child is unwell, do not send them to school. If they are unwell at school, you or your nominated emergency contact will need to collect them immediately. Please ensure your child's contact details are up to

date. If a student is absent without a medical reason for more than three days, this will be recorded as an unauthorised absence and will be followed up by the school.

If you have any questions regarding your child's attendance at school please call the office on 43 413555.

If someone in your family is being tested for COVID-19 we do ask that they stay home until results have been returned. If results are positive please contact the school immediately and all family members are to isolate for the required length of time.
























Washing our Hands and Science

3-6O decided to carry out a scientific experiment to determine which was the best method of cleaning our hands. We all know we have to keep our hands clean to prevent the spread of germs and viruses, like the Corona virus. This experiment helped us decide by testing different ways to wash.

We prepared petri dishes with an agar jelly for the germs to grow on then we touched each bit of jelly with our hands. We used dirty hands, hands washed with soap and hands washed with sanitiser. We also left one untouched as a 'control'.

To make it a fair test we did exactly the same actions for each petri dish and then we taped them shut so no more germs could get in.

Our result! We found that soap was the best cleaner as we found fewer bacteria growing on the agar jelly. Then hand sanitiser. The dirty hands grew the most bacteria.

Can we use this in real life? Yes we can. We think we should use soap as our first type of cleaner and then hand sanitiser if we don't have soap. Unclean hands spread the virus.

Whatever you do, make sure you always wash your hands!





Changes to Going Home Arrangements

Could you please ensure that your child is aware of how they will be going home in the afternoon. If these arrangements change during the day it would be appreciated if you could contact the office prior to 2.00pm to ensure that the message is passed on to your child.

Student Mobile Phones

Students who bring their mobile phone to school are asked to leave them at the office on their arrival and collect it at the end of the school day. Students are not permitted to have their phone with them during the day. It is also helpful if their name is on their phone.

Late Arrival / Early Departure

If your child is late arriving to school or needs to leave early for an appointment, a partial absence slip is to be collected from the school office prior to going to your child's classroom. This slip is given to the classroom teacher.

Payment of Money to the School

School fees and activity costs can be paid by credit card via the Woy Woy Public School website (http://www.woywoy-p.schools.nsw.edu.au/) using the 'Make a Payment' tab.

If you are making a cash payment please place the money in an envelope with the child's name, class and the reason clearly noted. We have cash collection envelopes at the school office for your use. All money is to be given to your child's teacher. When making payments for multiple children, separate money and envelopes for each child is appreciated, as it is very time-consuming to sort out at the time of receipting.






