

From the Principal

Term 3 Week 6

After a few very icy days we are back to some glorious weather which indicates spring is on its way. Many of our population suffer from hay fever and allergies or can have increased asthma symptoms if they are asthmatic during the season of spring. Pollen' from flowers and wind-borne allergens can cause runny noses and eyes and can bring on asthma symptoms. We still are susceptible to the common cold as well. It can be confusing during this COVID time to know what to do. The Department requires anyone showing any of the following symptoms to have a COVID test and only return to school following notification of their negative result. Better to keep safe and keep others safe.

Symptoms of COVID-19 include:

- fever (37.5°c or higher)
- cough
- sore/scratchy throat •
- shortness of breath
- loss of smell •
- loss of taste •

Other reported symptoms include:

- fatigue
- running nose •
- muscle pain •
- joint pain •
- headache •
- diarrhoea •
- nausea/vomiting •
- loss of appetite •

If children come to the sick bay with any of these symptoms we will be contacting you for them to go home and be tested unless we have a Doctor's letter or certificates stating otherwise. If your child suffers from asthma please ensure that we have a current asthma plan held here at the school along with their own personal ventolin spray provided. Thank you for your continued support with this extremely important matter.

The Tell Them From Me parent survey (Term 3, 2020)

I am pleased to inform you that this term, our school, like many other public schools in the state, will participate in a Department of Education initiative: the Tell Them From Me parent and student feedback surveys.

The Tell Them From Me surveys provide school leadership teams with insight into student engagement and wellbeing, and the impact of teaching practices at their school, from the perspective of students, teachers and parents. Data collected from the survey responses are compiled into reports for school leaders. The reports provide information that can help schools in their annual planning and reporting activities, by helping to identify emerging issues and plan for improvement.

The parent survey helps to clarify and strengthen the important relationship between parent and school. The survey is designed to measure, assess and report insights from the parent point of view at the school and system levels. The focus of this NSW survey is on student wellbeing, engagement and effective teaching practices. The survey questions aim to understand parents' perspectives on their child's experience at school, including teaching, communication and the school's support of learning and behaviour. The survey will ask questions about whether parents feel welcome, whether parents are informed, whether the school supports positive behaviour, whether the school supports learning, whether the school promotes safety and inclusion, and which means of communication parents feel are most effective as a means for exchanging information.

Survey responses are anonymous so staff in schools will not be able to identify individual parents or students from parent responses. The survey typically takes 15 minutes and is conducted entirely online through a secure website operated by the survey developers, The Learning Bar. You can complete the surveys on desktop computers, laptops, iPads, tablets and smartphones.

Check-in Assessments for Reading and Numeracy

This week our Year 5 students have completed the Check in Assessment in Literacy and Numeracy. NAPLAN could not be done this year but we have had the opportunity to have these Check in Assessments that will give us a solid indication of how our students are tracking and will also help us plan for the best support in future for these students. This will also aid us in our forward planning for the School Improvement Plan 2021-2014. Our Year 3 students will have an opportunity to complete these assessments early Term 4.

Excursions 2020

Unfortunately all excursions that were planned for 2020 are cancelled. Due to these excursions being to outside places within the general community, the Department of Education requires all schools to cancel all these types of excursions. For us this was any overnight excursion such as Canberra and the Great Aussie Bush Camps plus any day excursions to community venues like the Reptile Park and The Rocks in Sydney. These excursions are always important extra curricula activities here at Woy Woy Public School and enhance what the students learn at school. We are fortunate that a lot of places are now offering online experiences. It's not the same as physically being there but a good substitute to support students' learning in that area.

Rumbalara Excursions

It is exciting that Rumbalara Environmental Education Centre excursions can still go ahead at present as it is a Department of Education operated service with trained DoE staff and teachers. It has its own site and uses bushland settings that are not frequented by the public. The centre has a COVID plan in place to ensure the safety of all school's students and staff when attending.

Our lucky Year 3 and 4 students have had two beautifully sunny days on Monday and Tuesday this week visiting the Aboriginal sites here on the Central Coast. Not only have they had the opportunity to learn about Aboriginal culture but they have been able to be in a bush setting and enjoy a trip on a bus to their locations. Just the smiles on their faces when they return tells you they have had a great time. Hopefully all our Rumbalara excursions will continue for this year.

ICAS testing has begun

International Competitions and Assessments for Schools (ICAS) is a suite of six full-colour competitions designed specifically for primary and secondary students. ICAS are conducted annually in Australia and in over 20 countries in Asia, Africa, Europe the Pacific and America.

The knowledge and skills tested include Digital Technologies, English, Mathematics, Science, Spelling and Writing.

This week some of our students sat for the Science assessment and a numbers of students will sit for the other assessments as the year progresses. Comprehensive results are sent to parents on their children's achievements.

Woy Woy Public School MasterChef

Our version of MasterChef has begun and our little chefs are as eager as ever, cooking up delights in the heats to try and gain a place in the finals. The finals will be held later this term. A communication has been sent out to our parent community on numerous online platforms regarding safety on Park Road during the afternoon pick-ups. Concerned parents have brought the extremely important and frightening situation to our attention and rightly so. COVID-19 has certainly changed the way we have to drop off and pick up our children but it should not ever endanger the very people we are endeavouring to keep safe. We are monitoring what is happening and have changed teacher duties and supervision plans to try and solve the unsafe problem. We have approached the transport department for any short term support they may be able to extend. PLEASE it is you out there picking up. Watch for others, be considerate for others and do the right thing. Children have limited peripheral vision. Be aware of where they are. Drivers beware of the crossing and everyone use the crossing. Please remember the rules of our kiss and drop zone. It is for everyone. Thank you for supporting us with this very important safety issue. We need to work together to keep our children safe.

Opportunity classes - Year 5 updates

Owing to the most recent NSW Health advice received on 14 August, the Opportunity Class Placement Test has been rescheduled to Wednesday 18 November 2020 and will take place onsite here at Woy Woy Public School

Only students whose parents have received a confirmation email from the High Performing Students Team are eligible to sit the test on the new date of 18 November. The application portal will not be re-opened for new applications.

Further details will be announced as soon as they are confirmed.

Selective high schools - Year 7 updates

Entry to Year 7 in 2022 - We expect applications for placement in 2022 to open on 6 October 2020 and close on 9 November 2020. The test is expected to be held on 11 March 2021.

Assessments for the school assessment scores will be based on achievement on the school curriculum in Year 5 after 25 May 2020.

The information on this website is being updated as details of the changes to the test and other aspects of the placement process are confirmed.

Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) is a whole-school framework that promotes positive behaviour across our school. Every five weeks a team of teachers including the school Principal, executive staff and representatives from each stage analyse our school behavioural data. The results of this analysis leads our whole school implementation of Positive Behaviour for Learning. This fortnight teachers have been talking to students about how to 'Be Cooperative' especially when playing games with peers during break times. Lessons will focus on the importance of turn taking, playing by the rules and being a good sport. In the preschool our educators Mrs Arnot and Miss Williams are teaching their children strategies to make informed choices about their behaviours and talking to children about their emotions.



The NSW Department of Education has released an <u>Inclusive Education Statement for</u> <u>Students with Disability</u>.

This is the next step in the Department's Disability Strategy commitment to improve learning and wellbeing for students with disability in every public school. The Disability Strategy was released in February 2019, and sets out the Department's plan for providing children and young people with disability, their families and the broader community with an education system that meets their needs.

The statement is about strengthening inclusive education for all students with disability in mainstream schools and their support classes, and schools for specific purposes.

Inclusive education

Inclusive education means all students can access and fully participate in learning, supported by reasonable adjustments and teaching strategies tailored to meet their individual needs.

Inclusion should be embedded in all aspects of school life, and is supported by culture, policies and everyday practices.

All NSW public schools should champion inclusive education.

Have your say

The Department will listen and work with students, parents and educators over 2020 on what support is needed to strengthen inclusion of students with disability. This feedback will inform an Inclusive Education Policy and practice resources.
