COVID updates

It has been a challenging year for this year's HSC students and we wish to acknowledge our partner Woy Woy Campus which is part of our Brisbane Water learning Community and their staff as they strive to best support their students up to and through the HSC written exam period. NESA has released advice for schools around the HSC written exams. The Department has worked closely with NESA and is putting in place additional measures so that students and schools are prepared for the exams, have clear processes in place to conduct exams safely and know what to do in the event of a disruption to the scheduled exams.

Some happy news is that Year 12 students across NSW will be able to celebrate the completion of school with COVID-19 safe graduation ceremonies and formals being allowed to take place during Term 4 from 12 November, after the final HSC exam. Schools across NSW will receive COVID-19 safety plan guidance for Year 12 graduations and school formals on Friday the 11 September.

We know we have some siblings of Year 12 students attending here with us and we wish all Year 12 students the best as they prepare for the upcoming exams.

Executive Planning Day




On Tuesday our school Executive had a planning day to lay out our situationally analysis details and timeline. We also held an executive focus group discussion on how we viewed collaboration in school planning across the whole school site, evaluation of what we do and effective use of school resources. We looked at how we can involve students and parent voices in our school evaluation to the best advantage and looked at the timeline to get all these elements into place. It was an intense but very fruitful day's work.




Forensic Science

This year's Stage 3 Science Incursion is being presented by Education Interactive. The Online Enrolment System is designed to provide flexibility for parents to submit an Application to enrol in a NSW Government School online at the time that best suits them. The application can be accessed on all browsers and mobile devices including iOS and Android.

The online application process is currently restricted to:

- Enrolments into **local** schools only
- Children who are Australian citizens, New Zealand citizens or permanent residents
- Children who live in NSW

We offer our support and encourage you to complete your application to enrol online. If however, you do not feel comfortable completing an application online, a paper copy will be available for collection from the front office or can be downloaded from the Department's [going to a public school site](#).

Important Attendance Information



All students should be at school unless:

- they have a medical certificate which states that they are unable to return to school due to an ongoing medical condition
- they are currently unwell.

Rumbalara

On Monday the 24th of August and Tuesday the 25th of August Stage 2 went to Girrakool and Bulgandry. We travelled by bus with all of our amazing teachers and Stage Two students.

At Girrakool and Bulgandry we learnt about the traditional owners of the land. We learnt about their engravings and the tools they used like boomerangs, spears, axes, leaves, grinding rocks and volcanic rocks to make axes. They use wattle leaves for soap and they use the soap to clean themselves before going hunting so the animals cannot smell them. They also use the soap for a poison to stun the fish so they can catch them and eat them. When we walked to the waterfall there were stepping stones so you don't fall into the water. We sat quietly and heard a frog, we also saw a brush turkey.

The Aboriginals used ochre to put on their bodies for ceremonies. They use a strong rock to crush up a different rock and mix it with water. The white ochre is for people who don't know much about aboriginal culture. The red ochre is for people who know lots about aboriginal culture. Aborigines draw engravings of animals because they are connected with that animal, they know all about that animal and would never kill it. This would be their totem animal.

The Aborigines have lived sustainably for their whole lives. This means that there is enough for everyone. When they got a cut or hurt themselves they would get a piece of bark from the band aid tree and use some spider web to tie it in and to protect the cut. When the Aborigines can't get what they need they could trade with the other tribes. The Aborigines live off the land, have learnt how to make fire, eat bush tucker, make soap and do lots of things using the local environment. Aboriginals were the first people to make bread over 40, 000 years ago, before the Egyptians did.

I really enjoyed this excursion because we got to learn about the Aborigines who were the traditional owners of the land.




MasterChef 2020 Heat 5


Everyone who has competed through the competition have done so with grace and enthusiasm. I am so very proud of all their efforts. Our grand final will be held next week with a date to be advised.




