Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) Weeks 8, 9 & 10

Term 4

This week teachers have been teaching their students about how to 'BeCooperative' when playing games with their class and at break times. Lessons have focused on the importance of taking turns, playing by the rules and being a good sport. Students have also been reminded that games involving running or the throwing /kicking of large balls should be played on the oval.

As always, students who successfully demonstrate positive behaviours that are in-line with the schoolwide expectations set out in our school rules, will be rewarded with Win Bin tickets and stars on their Star Charts. Those students who have consistently demonstrated positive behaviour over the course of the term will receive their end-of-term PBL reward in Week 10. Kindergarten students will participate in a 'Wheels Party' under the COLA, Stage 1 students will have a movie and mufti afternoon, Support Unit classes will be watching a movie and having popcorn, Stage 2 students will enjoy a 'Wheels and Movie Day' and Stage 3 students will be having a Picnic Day. Students will need to have earned at least seven stars on their star charts in order to be eligible to receive these rewards. Please note that these rewards do not replace end-of-year celebratory events, and that all students are entitled to attend and participate in the end-of-year grade celebrations.

Wellbeing Programs

This semester we have implemented a number of wellbeing programs designed to support students emotionally and socially. Selected students across the school have continued to work each week with Grant Hickman in the Stronger, Braver, Wiser Mindfulness program developing mental, emotional and physical life skills and with Miss Henry and Mrs Wood in the Sparkle Girls and Lunch Brunch program. These students have gained confidence in setting boundaries with others and have developed improved communication skills and self-care strategies for resilience and emotion regulation.

The Online Enrolment System is designed to provide flexibility for parents to submit an Application to enrol in a NSW Government School online at the time that best suits them. The application can be accessed on all browsers and mobile devices including iOS and Android.

The online application process is currently restricted to:

- Enrolments into **local** schools only
- Children who are Australian citizens, New Zealand citizens or permanent residents
- Children who live in NSW

We offer our support and encourage you to complete your application to enrol online. If however, you do not feel comfortable completing an application online, a paper copy will be available for collection from the front office or can be downloaded from the Department's going to a public school site.

Important Attendance Information



All students should be at school unless:

- they have a medical certificate which states that they are unable to return to school due to an ongoing medical condition
- they are currently unwell.

If your child displays any COVID-19 symptoms they will be required to have a COVID test prior to returning to school. They will need to stay at home until results have been received and they are feeling well enough. We do kindly ask that if your child is unwell that you provide our office staff with details of symptoms.
