

#### From the Principal

#### Term 1 Week 4

Our Stephanie Alexander Kitchen Garden program is up and running, major excursions have been booked in for Term 3, Rumbalara environmental excursions are being finalised and our school calendar is filling up. A Term 1 calendar will be sent out with this newsletter. A wonderful year lies ahead of us. Thank you once again for your continued and positive support.

#### Our school's Strategic Improvement Plan 2021 – 2024

We mentioned last year how pleasing it was that so many parents felt motivated to complete the Tell Them From Me Parent Survey, and how much useful data this would give us to help develop our 2021 – 2024 Strategic Improvement Plan. As it turns out the data was invaluable, and we're well and truly on the road to producing a plan that is reflective of the opinions and aspirations of all of the different groups of people within our school community – students, teachers and parents/carers. What we'd really like to do now is take you through some of the results obtained from the surveys that were conducted, discuss the implications of the data and responses obtained, identify what we plan to do to address the issues that arose, and to again, ask for your input on what you'd like to see in the Strategic Improvement Plan.

For this purpose, we're holding a Parent Forum to discuss School Planning issues at the Everglades Country Club in three weeks' time. We'll let you know the exact date and time as soon as our booking is confirmed. All parents/carers and community members will be welcome; no bookings will be necessary. We look forward to seeing you there and to hearing your suggestions for how to make our school the best school it can be.

#### Information booklets going out

Unfortunately we were not able to hold face to face on site parent school information session this year. All Stages have put together a comprehensive overview of what your child will experience at school this year as well as some important operational information for you, in the form of an Information Booklet. These booklets will go out to all parents and carers over the next week. Kindergarten parents and carers have been informed of their information session arrangements as well.

#### School costs 2021

The school costs for 2021 will be found in your information booklet and you will also be getting notes from 3-6 classes about AVID package costs. The school is limiting costs for 2021 to help support our community as everyone slowly recovers from the 2020 COVID year. The school will cover the costs for the Mathletics program K-6, and the Sound Waves spelling online program Years 1-6. The school will also supplement the Interrelate program for Year 6 in Term 4 which normally would cost \$40 but for students it will only be \$10. The school will also provide a \$1 supplement for the Anti-bullying show and our generous P&C will match this. The school will also pay the full cost of a multicultural show so that all students have an opportunity to attend and enjoy. The school is not asking you to contribute any voluntary family funds in 2021 and our paper levy will also be voluntary. Any donations are always appreciated. As always class teachers will put out notes asking for voluntary contributions of tissues and hand soap etc. to support daily hygienic practices.

The school will continue to be supplied with COVID supplies such as hand sanitiser, gloves and the like. Please know that the school will not let any child miss out on important extra-curricular activities and excursions if financial hardship is the reason for not going. You are always welcome to contact Mrs Buckley or Mr Betts if you have concerns about your child attending any planned events. This will always remain confidential.

#### Fantastic news!

The school has been successful in gaining an upgrade for the school oval through the Regional Renewal program. This program is a recent initiative to support schools in being able to do large scale works on school grounds. To be able to be part of this initiative the school must put forward an amount of funds from their own school budget as well. The school has been trying for many years and have submitted many grant applications and put forward submissions in many rounds of government funding and to date had been unsuccessful. The upkeep of the oval has been an annual expense for the school budget over many years as well. It is extremely exciting to now be able to improve the quality of the school oval. The school oval will not be a proper sporting field but a green playing space for all our children. The oval being

on a sand base has always had the difficulty of being able to grow grass and maintain it successfully when our students constantly use it. The school will be working closely with the Regional Asset management team during the upgrade. The planned works will be done by this team and the contractors they engage. Initial meetings will take place soon but the up-grade timeline is from now until June 2022. Watch that space! Updates will be given in future newsletters. **How fantastic!!** The school is jumping for joy and we know our community will be too. We have waited a long long time.



#### First face to face P&C meeting since March 2020

Thank you to our P&C members for arranging and attending the P&C meeting last Wednesday night, 17<sup>th</sup> February. It had been such a long time since we had been able to meet face to face. Although it was done under a strict COVID plan it was a wonderful community connection that has been missed. Teachers and students have been discussing the importance of 'Being Safe' this fortnight. Through explicit lessons and activities we have reinforced the importance of staying together as a group when moving around the school and only using playground equipment when being supervised by a teacher. This coming fortnight, teachers will talk to their classes about 'Being Co-operative' especially during break times. We will be discussing the importance of sitting down while we eat, waiting for teacher instruction after eating time and the importance of staying in our designated areas until the eating bell has sounded. Woy Woy Public School takes a whole school approach to Positive Behaviour for Learning and your support is always very valued. #### Wellbeing across the school

Student wellbeing is a priority at Woy Woy Public School. Student resilience and wellbeing are essential for both academic and social development, and are optimised by safe, supportive and respectful learning environments. To ensure our students are well equipped to deal with the challenges life can sometimes provide us with we have implemented a number of Wellbeing Programs across the school.

#### **Top Blokes**

The Top Blokes program has commenced this year for selected Stage 3 boys and is designed to provide a social education program for boys aged between 10-13 years. The attending students will participate in an 8 week program where they will develop key social and decision making skills.





Stage 2 & 3 Mentoring Programs

Research shows that there are many ways of assisting students who need help to maximise their learning outcomes. One effective way of doing this is for teachers and other adults to work with students in small groups in a coaching or mentoring roles. Last year our Stage 3 students were provided with opportunities to engage in small group mentoring sessions with Mrs Amy Campbell our school Chaplin. This year we are offering the same opportunities to our Stage 2 students. Miss Henry will use conversation starters and games to provide a context to develop strong relationships and develop leadership skills in our Stage 2 and Stage 3 students.

These programs address many of the emerging social and emotional issues that children in our ever changing world face, if you would like any further information on these programs please contact Miss Henry through the front office.



In week 3 of this term students in K-6 were invited to participate in the Anti Bullying Show titled 'Buddies' delivered by the Brainstorm production team. All students were entertained by the performers who promoted cyber safety, friendship and anti bullying messages. Woy Woy Public School is a 'Bully Free' zone and on Friday 19 March we will continue to ensure we commit to taking action against bullying by participating in the 11th National Day of Action against Bullying and Violence.

#### Guliyali Preschool News



This year the entire P-6 WWPS community are implementing the Zones of Regulation strategy to support children in identifying their emotions, recognizing particular triggers and providing them with a toolbox of strategies in order to help them cope with stressors or frustrations that may arise in their world. Each morning and at different times throughout the day, we will encourage the children to "check in" by placing a picture of themselves into a coloured Zone which is displayed in the hollow. We agreed that we could only move our own picture and not our peers. Having pictures allows the children to visually see which zones other children are in.

Munch & Move is a NSW Health initiative that supports the healthy development of children birth to 5 years by promoting physical activity, healthy eating and reduced small screen time (e.g. watching TV or DVDs, playing on computers and small hand-held games devices).

Educators at Guliyali Preschool have participated in professional development to implement a fun, playbased approach to supporting healthy eating and physical activity habits in young children. So far this terms focus has been running and jumping. We've played 'What's the time Mr Wolf?' and a jumping game called 'Crossing the river.' After brainstorming a list of animals that jump, we discussed how kangaroo is traditional tucker for Aboriginal people. We then fried up some kangaroo to taste, which most of the children thought was delicious!

"Wellbeing incorporates both physical and psychological aspects and is central to belonging, being and becoming. Without a strong sense of wellbeing it is difficult to have a sense of belonging, to trust others and feel confident in being, and to optimistically engage in experiences that contribute to becoming" (EYLF, p33).
