## From the Principal

## Term 4 Week 4

How wonderful to have all of the children back at school. The school is once again full of noisy chatter, happy laughter, excited, active play and busy teachers providing care and curriculum related appropriate learning activities. Just what a school should be.

Thank you for your understanding and patience around the return to school for our students. We are still classed as a Level 3 plus school and must follow all the COVID restrictions for that level. A huge thank you to Mr Dan Betts for the many hours of organisation around making sure all our students are safe with staggered arrivals and departures, break times throughout the day, teacher's duties and designated gates for coming and going. Not an easy task. Just to see how happy and excited our students are to be back together in some way is well worth it.

### Leadership program for Year 5

Mrs Hauraki and Mr Brady will be running the Leadership program over the next few weeks for Year 5 students who are aspiring to student leadership positions for 2022. After the conclusion of this program voting will take place for the leadership positions by students from Year 2 to 5 and for all school staff. Successful leadership positions will be announced during the Presentation Day Assembly, be that online or face to face.

### Time to start planning for the school's 2022 structure

It is that time of year again when our school starts forward planning for the school structure for the next year. How we structure classes for 2022 will depend on the total number of students enrolled for 2022, the staffing entitlement the Department of Education allocates and numbers in each grade year. Teachers are in the best professional position to make the decision about where a child should be placed for the optimum possible benefit of their educational progress. We know that children grow and change as they progress through school. They change socially and their associations with other children change. Academically they may need support or challenge. It is important to remember that students are placed in classes to enhance their learning opportunities with sound teacher professional knowledge backed up by recorded assessment, work task results and classroom teacher observation expertise on the educational, social and emotional growth of a child. We do welcome your input in this process if you believe there are **extenuating circumstances that need to be considered** when placing your child in a class for 2022. You are welcome to make an appointment to meet with the Principal and discuss this matter. Alternately you can put your concerns in writing and address the correspondence to the Principal directly. Please always remember this process is totally confidential. All these requests will be taken into consideration, but we cannot guarantee that it will be possible to fulfil these requests, as numbers, teachers available and professional educational judgement will determine the final outcome. Classes will be formed at the end of the year for 2022 but as always may not be set until the beginning of 2022 when numbers of students on seats become apparent. All concerns regarding class placements for 2022 need to be in by **Friday 19<sup>th</sup> November 2021**.

## **Year 6 have only a short time left with us**

It is a sad time of year when we all come to the realisation that our Year 6 students will be ending their Primary School education and moving onto High School next year. Some of our Year 6 students have been at Woy Woy Public School since beginning Preschool. That is 8 years in the same school with many of the same friends and teachers. A very long association. Our thoughts are with them as they come to terms with leaving the comfortable confines of our supportive little school to join the throngs of the larger population of a high school campus with multiple teachers and classrooms for the different subjects they will be learning. A huge change lies ahead not only with the school change but with growing up as well. It is not easy being a young person between childhood and pending teenager in today's world. Our thoughts and wishes are with you Year 6. Make these last weeks of Primary School the best you can have.

## **Have you enrolled your Kindergarten child for 2022?**

A reminder about enrolling children beginning school in 2022. Enrolments are now being processed so classes can start to be formed and Kindergarten teachers placed. Hopefully we will get the chance to have some on site transition happening before the end of the year. Please let anyone you know who has a child ready to start school in 2022, it is time to finalise their enrolment.

## **Remote Learning Survey Results**

On behalf of all of the WWPS executive team, we'd like to thank everyone who completed a Remote Learning Survey at the end of Term 2. The feedback sent in by those who participated was instrumental in helping us to refine and improve upon the systems we had in place to deliver learning-from-home packages. The vast majority of respondents were overwhelmingly positive about the amount and the content of the work set for their children, but there were certainly some practical suggestions received on how to better cater to the needs of students and their families.

We were particularly interested to find out how well-received the Zoom sessions were. Early on in the piece we received some timely constructive feedback from one or two parents who felt that Zooms needed to be more structured and more focussed on lesson content, as opposed to being an opportunity to 'check-in' with the teacher. This feedback was gratefully received and was passed on to teachers. From this point onwards, it seems that most parents/carers appreciated the way that teachers increased the number of zooms that they offered over the course of the learning from home period. Results from the surveys indicated that across the various stages of learning, the majority of parents felt that the Zoom sessions the teachers delivered were well-organised and engaging. Some parents/carers commented that they would have preferred more sessions and/or multiple sessions per day. It's worth noting that for every respondent who felt this way, there were as many, or more parents who felt that their children experienced 'Zoom fatigue', found it hard to maintain their concentration or felt slightly uncomfortable making contributions in this online environment. Overall, we were very proud of the way that our teachers adapted and refined their delivery of Zoom sessions and were able to support students to complete the work that had been set for them.

We were also interested in whether the parents of children in Years 1, 2, 3 and 4 would have preferred to have had their children completing work online, in the same way that students in Years 5 and 6 did (i.e. using the Google Classroom platform).

The vast majority of respondents indicated that they felt that Google Classroom would result in too much screen time for students in their early years of schooling, and that the booklets promoted actual physical practise of handwriting and spelling skills that are crucial at this stage of schooling.


Many of the stages of learning were able to make important changes to their systems for the delivery of the first two/three weeks of Learning-from-home work packages for Term 4. The work in Year 3 and 4 booklets was changed so that it was organised in terms of work that needed to be completed each day of the week, whereas the work had formerly been organised into subject areas. Year 5 and 6 History, Geography and Science and Technology activities were simplified and pared back based on the feedback received in their survey. We also learned that although parents appreciated the fact that teachers sent handy tips and instructions to students via ClassDojo to help and guide them to complete their work, these messages may have been more useful if delivered at the end of the previous day's learning, so that families who wanted to hit the ground running the next day were able to do so.

All-in-all, the survey results indicated that the school got a lot of things right in attempting to provide work and guidance to support our students to learn from home, using systems that were equitable, organised and engaging. That being said, we received some very useful constructive criticism, and this was acted upon to improve the learning-from-home experience for all concerned, including making things easier for parents. Again, we'd like to thank all that took the time to complete these surveys – your input was valued and greatly appreciated.

## Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) Week 4 & 5



This week, as we all settle back into the rhythm of school our teachers and students have been talking about how to 'Be Cooperative', especially when playing games. Lessons have had a focus on playing by the rules, taking turns and being a good sport. Stage 2 students have created videos demonstrating cooperative behaviours and these will be viewed across the school this week to lead conversations about the expected behaviour.

Next fortnight we will be focussing on the 'Be Safe' expectation and students and teachers will be discussing the importance of staying in bounds, wearing a hat, staying off the fixed play equipment when it is not supervised and keeping out of the toilet blocks unless using the bathroom.

# Meet 'Yali'

On 25<sup>th</sup> October our newly named Positive Behaviour for Learning mascot 'Yali' welcomed back our students. The name Yali was chosen from a number of entries submitted during Term 2. Yali is a shortened version of the Aboriginal word for pelican (Guliyali) in traditional Kamilaroi language. We are so excited to introduce Yali to our school community and thank everyone for their name contributions.



## What you need to know about 'vaping'

NSW public schools treat vaping the same as smoking cigarettes, as outlined in the Drugs in Schools Policy: Smoking (including vaping) on school premises, including school buildings, gardens, sports fields and car parks, is prohibited for all students, employees and visitors.

Parents and carers will be concerned to know that the Department of Education has reported an increase in students using e-cigarettes, or "vaping". By talking to your child about e-cigarettes, you may help prevent them from vaping.



## What are e-cigarettes?

E-cigarettes, or electronic cigarettes, are battery-operated devices that heat a liquid into a vapour that users inhale. Vapes will likely expose the user and bystanders to chemicals and toxins such as propylene glycol, glycerol and ethylene glycol.

## What can I do as a parent or carer?

Parents, carers, and the community can support the school and our students by being informed about this concern and to speak to their children about making positive decisions.

Talk with your child, prepare yourself by getting the facts and role model an environment that's free of cigarettes and e-cigarettes.

## Attendance Health Reminder

In accordance with [advice from NSW Health](#)External link, parents and carers are reminded **NOT** to send children to school if they are unwell, even if they have the mildest flu-like symptoms.

NSW Health has requested that schools encourage anyone who is unwell or has even mild flu-like symptoms, to arrange to be tested through their local medical practitioner or one of the [COVID-19 clinics](#)External link.

Students and staff with flu-like symptoms need to be tested and provide a copy of a negative COVID-19 test result and be symptom-free before being permitted to return to school.







### Changes to Going Home Arrangements

Could you please ensure that your child is aware of how they will be going home in the afternoon. If these arrangements change during the day it would be appreciated if you could contact the office prior to 2:00pm to ensure that the message is passed on to your child.

### Skoolbag APP and Website

You can download the WWPS Skoolbag APP to both iPhone and Android devices. Event updates and important information will be sent out via our Skoolbag APP, and you can record your child's absence from school here as well. 

### Option 1 Email the order direct (preferred method for faster delivery)

2. Invoice is emailed to you with payment options of Credit Card or Direct Deposit
3. Once money cleared delivery of stock to the classroom weekly

### Option 2 Fill in an order form and leave at the office

1. Invoice is emailed to you with payment options of Credit Card or Direct Deposit
2. If paying cash, it must be CORRECT cash (this method may take an extra week)
3. Once money cleared delivery of stock to the classroom weekly

### Option 3 Buy direct from the shop (when available)

1. Uniform Shop opening times advertised in the newsletter and digital platforms (during school term)
  2. EFTPOS and correct cash accepted

## FAQ

### What if I order the wrong size?

Email [wowwaypublicschool-uniform@pandcaffiliate.org.au](mailto:wowwaypublicschool-uniform@pandcaffiliate.org.au) within 14 days for the uniform shop coordinator to advise the appropriate steps. Return items must be WITH TAGS ON and NOT WORN.

### I only have cash how can I order?

Please note this process may take an extra week to process. Correct money with the order in a sealed envelope can be left at the office.

### Will I be reminded about the shop opening times?

Yes, there will be reminders in the newsletter, on the SkoolBag App, School Official FB page and Parents of Way Way School Facebook page.

## Refund, Exchange & Returns Policy

The Uniform Shop will accept returns and provide customers with an exchange, refund or repair where the customer can provide adequate proof of purchase by way of receipt and the following terms and conditions are followed:

- Exchanges can only be made within 14 days of purchase.
- No refund will be given for an incorrect size choice only an exchange and the item must have original tag and have not been washed and is in an "as new" condition.
- All faulty items need to be reviewed by the manufacturer before a decision is made regarding refund, repair or exchange.
