From the Principal

Term 4 Week 2

Welcome back for the final term of the 2022 school year. We're two weeks in now and have certainly hit the ground running. The term kicked off with our annual Science Fair, which for the first time was open to all students from Kindergarten through to Year 6. Some amazing projects were unveiled, with students being given the opportunity to demonstrate the extent of their ability to think in critical and creative ways and wowing us with the results. Thanks to Mrs Young and her team for their efforts in organising the fair. You can read more about the Science Fair further on in this edition of the Namalata. The event was just one of a number of exciting, student-centred celebrations planned for this term. Read on to find out more about what's been happening, and what's coming up in the next few weeks.

Music lessons

Music lessons began Day 1 Week 1, with all classes from K to 6 now having had a lesson with Mrs Jones. The feedback from students and teachers alike was that the lessons were highly engaging and thoroughly enjoyable. As mentioned in previous communiques, we anticipate the program will deliver academic benefits for our students, as well as social and emotional wellbeing benefits. We expect to see positive outcomes for behaviour, learning and mental health from the program. We feel extremely fortunate to have been given the opportunity to work with the Australian Children's Music Foundation (ACMF), who have provided the funding for the program, and who were able to put us in contact with Mrs Jones. What an amazing opportunity for the students of Woy Woy Public School.

On a related note, a letter was sent home at the end of last term about a documentary being filmed here at the school this term. Kaye Harrison is an experienced and accomplished local filmmaker. Her documentary will focus on the power of music to build community and to benefit the wellbeing of young people on the Central Coast. Students whose parents have previously indicated that they do not want their children to appear in media releases will not appear in any scenes of the documentary unless parents contact the school to advise us otherwise. The note also gave other parents the opportunity to opt-out of filming on behalf of their children. Please contact the school if you have any further questions about the documentary.

Walk-a-thon

In the last edition of the Namalata we announced the fact that the school, in conjunction with the Woy Woy PS P & C, would be organising a walk-a-thon this term. We can now reveal that the walk-a-thon will be held on Friday 18 November. The event promises to be a great deal of fun with a sausage sizzle, plant sale and stalls organised for the day. We can also reveal that we have already raised almost \$5 000, and there's still a month to go before our students get walking! All money raised will go towards the establishment of an outdoor learning and play space. The area will be available for all students to learn, play, exercise, explore and use their imagination. Students in our support unit classes in particular, are in need of a space that is engaging and accessible. As you can see, it's a very worthy cause.

Both excursions should provide students with very valuable opportunities for outdoor environmental education and for investigating sustainability issues.

By all accounts the children had a lovely time. They were certainly all smiles as they left the school that afternoon. 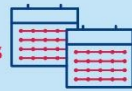

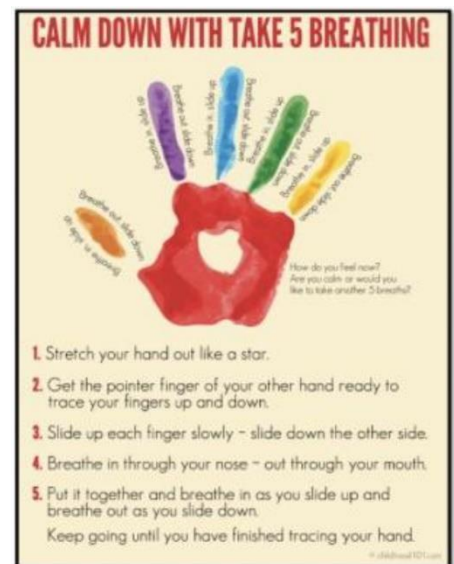
Students at WWPS have been adding to their strategies of being aware of emotions and how to respond to them. In Lesson 6 this fortnight we have explored sensory strategies – ways to keep our body and mind grounded when we feel like we are in the YELLOW, BLUE or RED zones and we have begun to sort through the strategies that are the 'best-fit' for us personally.

Lesson 6: Exploring Sensory Strategies

Students develop understandings that while a particular strategy might be useful and calming for them, it may have a different effect on another person. They develop skills to reflect on diversity and acceptance of individual needs and differences.

HOW CAN YOU HELP?

- ✓ Talk to your child about what strategies they enjoyed? Look at some strategies together to help refresh their memory.
- ✓ Talk to your child about the idea that if a strategy does not work the first time, or in certain situations, not to discard it. They simply keep it with their strategies and try it again another time or in a different situation.
- ✓ **Ask your child to teach you the 5 senses 5-4-3-2-1 strategy.**
- ✓ **Have you tried these sensory strategies? Wall sits:** Secure your back to the wall at the height of a student's chair, or knee-level. Challenge: see how long you can sit against the wall! **Wall push ups:** Secure hands to the wall at chest height for child. How many wall push-ups can they do? Challenge them to push so hard on the handprints that they "push the wall down"!



AT HOME ZONES IDEAS



Mindfulness in Practice

Our youngest learners enjoy their daily mindfulness activities. When we teach mindfulness to children, we equip them with tools to build self-esteem, manage stress, and skilfully approach challenges. Teaching mindfulness to children can help shape three critical skills developed in early childhood: paying attention and remembering information, shifting back and forth between tasks, and behaving appropriately with others. These abilities are known as executive functions and they are essential for more advanced tasks like planning, reasoning, problem-solving, and positive social relationships.



Chaplaincy Program

Mr Gary Cooke, our school Chaplain is at our school every Monday and Tuesday. School Chaplains support the wellbeing of students by providing strategies that support the wellbeing of the broader school community and looking after the personal needs of students, not just their academic needs, through the provision of general spiritual and personal advice. Mr Cooke works with small groups of children in Years 3-6 each week to support their emotional and social growth through a range of engaging and targeted activities.

Student Mobile Phones

FAQ

What if I order the wrong size?

Email waywaypublicschool-uniform@pandacafilliate.org.au within 14 days for the uniform shop coordinator to advise the appropriate steps. Return items must be WITH TAGS ON and NOT WORN.

I only have cash how can I order?

Please note this process may take an extra week to process. Correct money with the order in a sealed envelope can be left at the office.

Refund, Exchange & Returns Policy

The Uniform Shop will accept returns and provide customers with an exchange, refund or repair where the customer can provide adequate proof of purchase by way of receipt and the following terms and conditions are followed:

- Exchanges can only be made within 14 days of purchase.
- No refund will be given for an incorrect size choice only an exchange and the item must have original tag and have not been washed and is in an "as new" condition.
- All faulty items need to be reviewed by the manufacturer before a decision is made regarding refund, repair or exchange.
- Any item to be reviewed by the manufacturer needs to be returned in a clean and freshly laundered condition.
- The Uniform Shop will not hand out replacement items until the manufacturer has decided on repair, refund or exchange. This process may take several weeks.
- All decisions will be notified to the customer.
- The Uniform Shop reserves the right not to offer an exchange, refund or repair on items where the item fault is the result of misuse, neglect or incorrect washing instructions of the item.
- The Uniform Shop reserves the right to assess the condition and age of returned goods prior to providing a repair, refund or exchange. This may result in repair, refund or exchange being refused.
- If a refund is granted, the refund will be issued to a nominated bank account.

In the Opal network, we strongly encourage these families to have their children travel with a Child/Youth Opal card until they receive their valid School Opal card. If outside Greater Sydney, parents should contact their [local bus operator](#) to discuss their travel needs.

Bus operators are flexible and understanding, particularly at the start of the school year, and will ensure students can travel safely to and from school. But to best support our operators we encourage all students to have a valid ticket, as early as possible, from the start of the school year.

Term 4 2022

2023 school travel applications are now open

Applications for student travel in 2023 open from **Monday 10 October 2022**.

Students who need a School Opal card or travel pass for 2023 can [apply](#) now. A new application will need to be submitted if they are applying for the first time, or if they are requesting an additional travel entitlement as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation (e.g. joint custody).

Students who change address, school, campus location, have repeated a year or received an expiry notification from Transport for NSW for their school travel entitlement should [renew or update](#) their details before **the end of term 4**. This will ensure that schools can endorse applications, and entitlements remain valid for the start of the 2023 school year. School Opal card holders will have the changes applied to their existing card.

If a student's distance eligibility has changed based on their grade (i.e. grade two to grade three), the system will automatically update their entitlement if they meet the new criteria. If they do not meet the new [eligibility criteria](#), we will send an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition that is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

[Term Bus Pass](#) holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

Students in the Opal network applying for an Opal card (including a Term Bus Pass) for the first time will receive their Student Opal card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2023.

Students living in rural and regional (R&R) areas should receive their travel pass at the start of the new school year from their nominated transport operator. It may come via the school or be sent directly to them at home. **Note:** some R&R operators do not issue travel passes.

Students/parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

Travel from Term 1 2023

We ask that parents plan ahead and make sure their child knows which service/s to use and has a valid ticket to travel; either a School Opal card or Child/Youth Opal card (within Greater Sydney) or a School Travel Pass (outside Greater Sydney), from the start of the school year.

Applications for 2023 School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS) travel open at the start of Term 4 2022, so parents/students can [apply](#) or [update](#) details early and be ready for the start of the new school year.

Most students using the Opal network will not need a new Opal card and can continue travelling on their existing card each year.

The start of the year is a busy period for local transport operators, and students travelling without a valid ticket make service planning and operations difficult.
