

### Term 1 Week 9

What a busy fortnight we have had at school. It was great to see some sun shine – even if only briefly. The big news for us this week was that we were officially playing on the school oval. ### Rapid Antigen Testing for the rest of the Term

From the Principal

This week the NSW Department of Education unveiled plans for how they'd like us to proceed with rapid antigen testing for the rest of the term. We'll be providing another batch of RAT kits to families for use for the rest of the term. The NSW Department of Education is no longer asking you to test your children twice a week (or each day if your children are in a Support Unit class). RAT's need only be used if your child is presenting with symptoms of COVID-19. This being the case, the department has stipulated that each family should receive at least 5 RAT's per child.

We have decided that the quickest and easiest way to get this batch of RAT's to families would be to send them home with children in their school bags next week. We'll only send sealed boxes home in school bags so that parents can rest assured they're getting test kits that haven't been tampered with.

We are aware that some people will not want to receive a/another consignment of RAT's, and we respect the rights and opinions of people who feel this way. Please contact your child's teacher via ClassDojo, email or telephone the school, if you do NOT want us to send home any RAT's.

If you would like RAT kits, but don't want them sent home with your child, please also contact your child's teacher or the school office.

Please note that if you do not contact the school, we will assume that you consent to the kits being sent home with your child. There will be no roadside collection points in operation for the distribution of this last round of RAT's.

### Excursions

### NAPLAN

NAPLAN is a national literacy and numeracy assessment that students in Years 3, 5, 7 & 9 sit in May each year. It is the only national assessment all Australian students do. As students' progress through their school years, it's important to check how well they are learning the essential skills of reading, writing and numeracy. NAPLAN assesses the literacy and numeracy skills that students are learning through the school curriculum and allows parents/carers to see how their child is progressing against national standards and over time. NAPLAN is just one aspect of a school's assessment and reporting process. It doesn't replace ongoing assessments made by teachers about student performance, but it can provide teachers with additional information about students' progress. NAPLAN also provides schools, education authorities and governments with information about how education programs are working and whether young Australians are achieving important educational outcomes in literacy and numeracy. The NAPLAN online test window starts on Tuesday 10 May and finishes on Friday 20 May 2022. ### Attendance

Education in New South Wales is compulsory for all children between the ages of six years and below the minimum school leaving age. The Education Act 1990 requires that parents ensure their children of compulsory school age are enrolled at and regularly attend school. Following an absence from school you must ensure that within 7 days you provide your child's school with a verbal or written explanation for the absence. However, if the school has not received an explanation from you within 2 days, the school may contact you to discuss the absence. Our school class times are 8:50am – 2:50pm. Arriving late is sometimes unavoidable, however consistent late arrivals disrupt classes and student learning is affected.

Dear Parents and Students,

Due to roadworks on Carpenter Street between Veron Road & Ryans Road, Umina Beach from Monday 4<sup>th</sup> April to Friday 29<sup>th</sup> April 2022 there will be a change a path of Route 57 departing Rabaul Avenue & McEvoy Avenue at 8:29am. Route 57 will operate the current route from Rabaul Avenue & McEvoy Avenue to Carpenter Street & Ryans Road then via right Ryans Road, left Connex Road, left Carpenter Street then continues the current path to school.

In lieu of the bus stops being missed on Carpenter Street, there will be temporary bus stops located on Connex Road near Veron Road and Ryans Road near Connex Road. (See map for further details).
