### *Athletics Carnival*

We were fortunate to spend a few hours at the Athletics Carnival last week and were struck by how happy and well-behaved our students were on the day. Staff have reported higher levels of participation from students than in previous years with students seemingly embracing a 'Have-a-go' attitude in order to accrue points for their sports houses, which is extremely pleasing to see. There were some fantastic individual performances – demonstrations of endurance, strength, agility and speed – as well as some very closely fought battles on the racetrack. I'm pleased to report that I saw lots of proud smiles on faces and good sportsmanship on display from all students. I'd like to thank Ms Moore for her efforts in organising the carnival, and all of the teachers that were in attendance on the day, all of whom contributed to the smooth running of the carnival. It was lovely to see so many parents in attendance on the day. Thank you to everyone who came to support their sons and daughters and to cheer on our students.

### *Drop-off and Pick-up Time*

A quick reminder to parents/carers to be careful when dropping children off in the morning or picking them up in the afternoons. Please park only in designated parking areas, or use the 'Kiss-and-Ride' zone (Park

Road only). We had a situation unfold during the week, during which a parent/carer pulled up across the driveway to the staff carpark to let their child out, at the same time as an assisted transport vehicle was attempting to reverse out of the driveway. Unfortunately, one of our staff members was also attempting to access the carpark and was caught in between the parent's car and the assisted transport officer's car. Our staff member's car was damaged in the incident, and while this was a disappointing outcome for him, he expressed relief that no one was hurt. We as a school community have a responsibility to drive our vehicles and to park our vehicles in a manner that poses no risk to our students, or for that matter, any members of our school community. Please consider others at drop-off and pick-up time.

## *Inappropriate Use of Technology*

The vast majority of students who bring mobile phones to school each day do the right thing and act in accordance with the school's directive that they hand their phones in at the office at the start of the school day and retrieve them at the end of the school day. There is good reason for this policy. On the one hand leaving expensive phones in school bags outside classrooms unsupervised is problematic, and on the other hand, there are many students here at the school whose parents have indicated that they do not give permission for their child's/children's photographs to be taken. It is for this second reason that we ask students not to take out their phones until they have left the school grounds. Students are not permitted to use their phones while waiting in the bus lines for the bus to arrive. We understand that some children may need to communicate with their parents at this time and are more than happy to allow students to do this if they ask permission from the teacher on bus duty. A commonsense approach applies. We appreciate your support in encouraging your child/children to keep their phone where it should be until they've left school for the day.

On a related note, the school has spoken with a number of students and parents in recent weeks about inappropriate cyber interactions on websites such as Instagram, Facebook and Snapchat, and when gaming on Play Stations and the like. We strongly recommend that if you decide to allow your child to access and use these forums, you encourage them to report any negative comments they receive to you, or better still, that you regularly monitor their interactions. We are increasingly finding children of primary school age don't have the requisite life experience to enable them to deal appropriately with conflicts that arise on social media platforms.

## *Happy Holidays*

Before we part ways for the holiday break, we'd like to take the opportunity to thank all of our parents, carers and community members for their involvement and for their support of what we try to achieve here at WWPS. We'd also like to thank the teachers, SLSO's, prac teachers and all of the staff here at WWPS for their dedication and hard work and for everything they do for the students of Woy Woy Public School.

## Zones of Regulation



We are very excited to be commencing our 'Zones of Regulation' program in week 1 Term 3. The focus of the first lesson introduces students to the four 'Zones of Regulation' (©Social Thinking, 2011). Using images of various feelings, students learn to identify the four 'Zones' which are the foundation of the program. Students work on increasing their vocabulary of emotions and recognition of facial expressions.

How can you help?

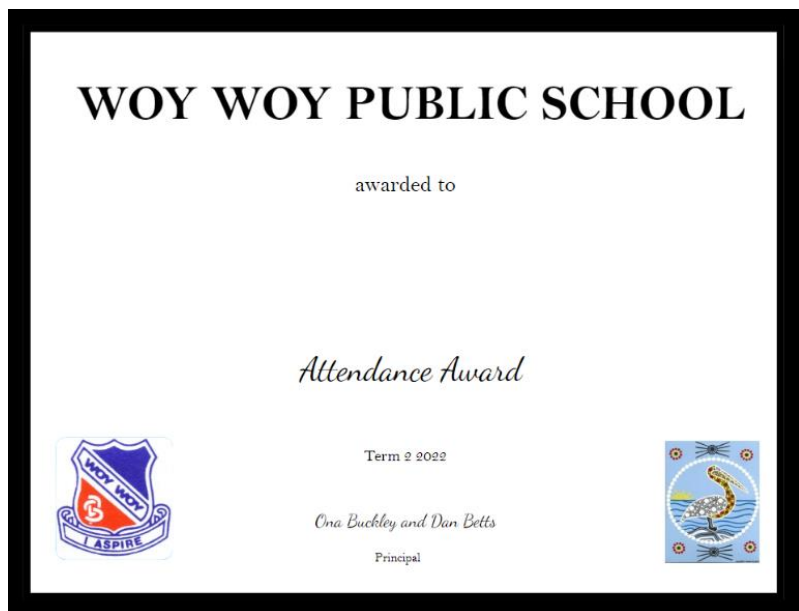
- Use the language and talk about the Zones your child has experienced across the day. You might like to keep a copy of the Zones somewhere at home which is handy to refer to as your own 'check in' system. A visual of the 4 zones will be sent home to support understanding.
- Help your child gain an awareness of his or her Zone and feelings by pointing out your observations ie, "I can see you are frustrated, you are in the yellow zone".
- Encourage your child to share his or her Zone with you and help them to become comfortable using the language to communicate their feelings and ways they can respond accordingly.
- Model how you feel - what Zone you would be in and what you will do to regulate your emotions.

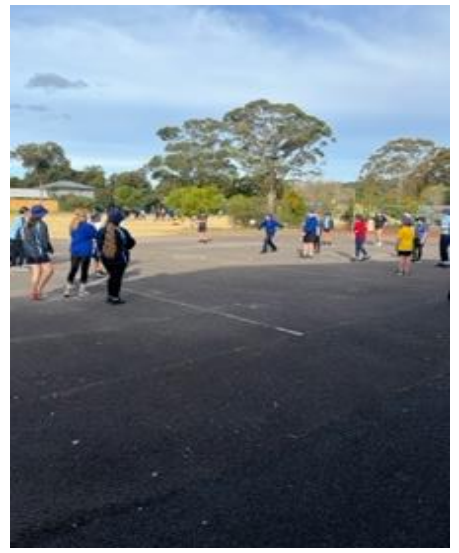

# Aquaponics Gardening

With a rapidly increasing global population, and the scary statistics that there will be more plastic in the ocean than fish by 2050, there is a growing need for food. Aquaponics is gaining popularity as more and more people look for sustainable, eco-friendly ways to grow food.

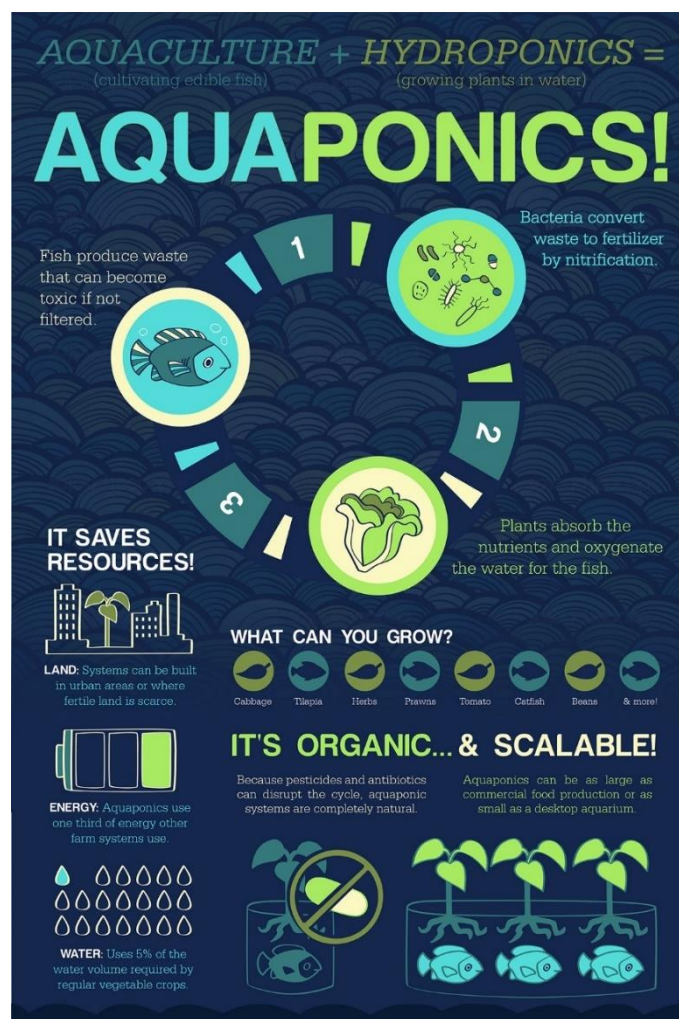
Aquaponics is a sustainable growing technique that combines elements of both hydroponics and aquaculture in one integrated system, an environmentally friendly way to produce fish and plants simultaneously in a closed loop system.

Students in 5/6G this week during gardening lessons conducted their own research on the topic, looking at ways this system is more sustainable.

- Prydi's research found that Aquaponics produce at least 10 times more crops in the same amount of space as traditional agriculture.
- Edie found out Aquaponics consumes 75% less energy than mechanised agriculture
- Emilie and Heidi discovered it uses 80-95% less water than traditional farming methods.

Gardening in Term 3 will be focusing on our Aquaponics garden. We are excited to get our STEM hat on and linking the STEM process beyond the classroom. The teaching and food growing system integrates plant and fish biology with chemistry, maths and engineering. It will become a magical wonderland of plants, fish and animals all interacting with excited, engaged, and amazed children. We are keen to document our journey and share this with our community.

## Refund, Exchange & Returns Policy

The Uniform Shop will accept returns and provide customers with an exchange, refund or repair where the customer can provide adequate proof of purchase by way of receipt and the following terms and conditions are followed:

- Exchanges can only be made within 14 days of purchase.
- No refund will be given for an incorrect size choice only an exchange and the item must have original tag and have not been washed and is in an "as new" condition.
- All faulty items need to be reviewed by the manufacturer before a decision is made regarding refund, repair or exchange.

- The Uniform Shop will not hand out replacement items until the manufacturer has decided on repair, refund or exchange.
- This process may take several weeks.
- All decisions will be notified to the customer.
- The Uniform Shop reserves the right not to offer an exchange, refund or repair on items where the item fault is the result of misuse, neglect or incorrect washing instructions of the item.
- The Uniform Shop reserves the right to assess the condition and age of returned goods prior to providing a repair, refund or exchange. This may result in repair, refund or exchange being refused.
- If a refund is granted, the refund will be issued to a nominated bank account.
