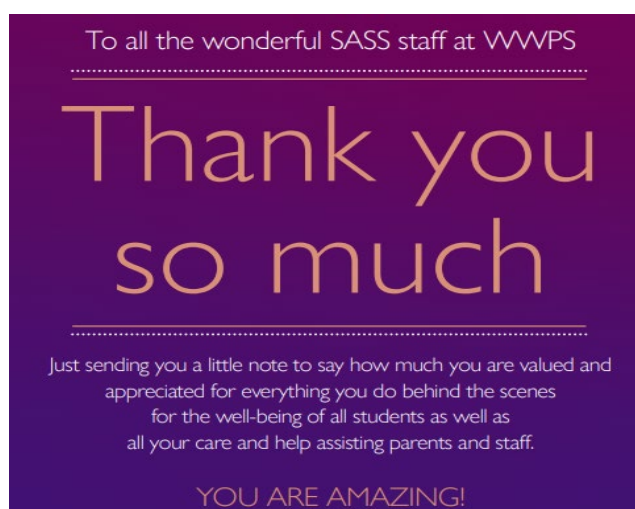

### SASS Appreciation Week

If you've had occasion to visit the school office this week you may have noticed streamers, balloons, flowers and the like decorating the hallway and the office doorway. This was done in celebration of SASS Appreciation Week. It was an opportunity for the staff of Woy Woy Public School to acknowledge the wonderful work done by all of our School Administrative Officers – Sandra, Kath, Sharon and (sometimes) Lynn, our School Administrative Manager – Linda, our GA – Macca, and all of the amazing School Learning Support Officers (SLSO's) who work with children in classrooms. We consider ourselves incredibly lucky to have such dedicated, hard-working and professional people working in the school for the benefit of students and family and community members. They all do an absolutely amazing job and we as a staff were happy to be able to spoil them a little bit over the course of the week.

SASS Appreciation Week didn't go unnoticed in the parent community either evidently, as we received this lovely card and message from Mrs Lea Colwell:

"To our Educational Support Staff at WWPS, thank you for all the support you provide, ensuring that the school community's needs are met. The work you do behind the scenes every day and adjusting to new ways of doing your job is amazing – you are an integral part of our school team and make a huge difference to our staff, our students, and our families – thank you!"



### NAPLAN 2022 Results

This year the school had a target of having between 32.8% to 39.6% of our students in the top two skill bands for the NAPLAN Reading assessment. We are thrilled to report that 46.5% of our Year 3 and Year 5 students were placed in the top two bands for Reading. Not only did we very comfortably exceed the system-generated targets set for us, we also exceeded the average percentage for students from statistically similar schools by more than 10 percentage points. This is in fact the highest percentage of students in the top two bands for Reading recorded at Woy Woy Public School, exceeding the previous high of 38.6% from 2019.

Our target for NAPLAN Numeracy was to have between 24.4% to 31.0% of our students in the top two skill bands. Again, we're pleased to report that we achieved the target set for us with 29.2% of students placed in the top two bands for Numeracy. This is, once again, more than 7 percentage points higher than the figure obtained for statistically similar schools and is the highest recorded percentage of students in the top two bands for Numeracy recorded at Woy Woy Public School, exceeding the previous high of 28.9% from 2017.

Similarly, we had set ourselves a target of having between 35.3% to 46.8% of our Aboriginal students placed in the top three skill bands for the NAPLAN Reading assessment. 100% of Aboriginal students achieved this feat in 2022. We were hoping to have between 48.1% to 59.6% of our Aboriginal students placed in the top three skill bands for the NAPLAN Numeracy assessment, and again, we're very pleased to report that 66.7% of Aboriginal students achieved this.

These remarkable results are testament to the hard work and application of our Year 3 and Year 5 students this year, and to the quality of the teaching programs delivered by the teachers of Woy Woy Public School, from Kindergarten through to Year 6. Well done everyone, and congratulations again to our students. The hard work has paid off and we're very proud of the results you've been able to achieve.

### **The Tell Them From Me parent survey (Term 3, 2022)**

I am pleased to inform you that this term, our school, like many other public schools in the state, will participate in a Department of Education initiative: the Tell Them From Me parent and student feedback surveys.

The Tell Them From Me surveys provide school leadership teams with insight into student engagement and wellbeing, and the impact of teaching practices at their school, from the perspective of students, teachers and parents. Data collected from the survey responses are compiled into reports for school leaders. The reports provide information that can help schools in their annual planning and reporting activities, by helping to identify emerging issues and plan for improvement.

The parent survey helps to clarify and strengthen the important relationship between parent and school. The survey is designed to measure, assess and report insights from the parent point of view at the school and system levels. The focus of this NSW survey is on student wellbeing, engagement and effective teaching practices. The survey questions aim to understand parents' perspectives on their child's experience at school, including teaching, communication and the school's support of learning and behaviour. The survey will ask questions about whether parents feel welcome, whether parents are informed, whether the school supports positive behaviour, whether the school supports learning, whether the school promotes safety and inclusion, and which means of communication parents feel are most effective as a means for exchanging information.

Survey responses are anonymous so staff in schools will not be able to identify individual parents or students from parent responses. The survey typically takes 15 minutes and is conducted entirely online through a secure website operated by the survey developers, The Learning Bar. You can complete the surveys on desktop computers, laptops, iPads, tablets and smartphones.

### **Code of Conduct for Parents, Carers and Visitors**

The Woy Woy Public School Code of Conduct for Parents, Carers and Visitors is designed to ensure that everyone who visits the school site is able to do so in a safe and harmonious manner and that students, staff, parents, carers and other visitors are not subjected to aggressive, hostile or violent behaviours.

The document (which is attached to this edition of the Namalata) sets out the standards of behaviour expected of those who visit the school. In particular, the document states that all parents, carers and visitors are expected to treat all persons associated with the school with respect and courtesy. The code also stipulates that any issues or concerns about the school, staff, other parents or students be raised via the correct school procedures. We would like to emphasise the fact that the code is very clear about parents not approaching other people's children if they are upset with them for any reason. Please refer your concerns to teachers or members of the school's executive team and let us handle the matter from there.

To quote directly from the document: "Your co-operation is sought and greatly appreciated, so that we all maintain a safe, harmonious and happy learning environment for every student, parent and staff member at Woy Woy Public School."

### **Afternoon Traffic Congestion on Park Road**

More than one person has contacted the school in recent weeks to express concern about the incorrect use of the 'Kiss and Ride' zone outside the doors to the school's office. Here's what the Service NSW website has to say about Kiss and Ride zones:

"Kiss and Ride Zones are designed for your convenience and for your child's safety. Designed for quick entry and exit, these zones minimise congestion and risk when used properly by all parents and carers. These zones operate under the same conditions as no parking zones, which means you may stop to drop off or pick up children for a maximum of 2 minutes. You're required to remain in, or within 3 metres of, your vehicle..."

The fact that people are sitting for, in some cases, a lot longer than the two minute maximum means that far from having the effect of minimising traffic congestion, the opposite is in fact the case – they are adding to, perhaps even causing, congestion problems. We therefore ask that all parents who use the Kiss and Ride zone, do so in the spirit intended and stop for no more than two minutes. Doing so will allow more motorists to use the zone, and as a consequence we hope to see fewer vehicles stopping in the 'No Stopping' zone. We ask that you please comply with these road rules for the sake of the safety of the students of Woy Woy Public School.

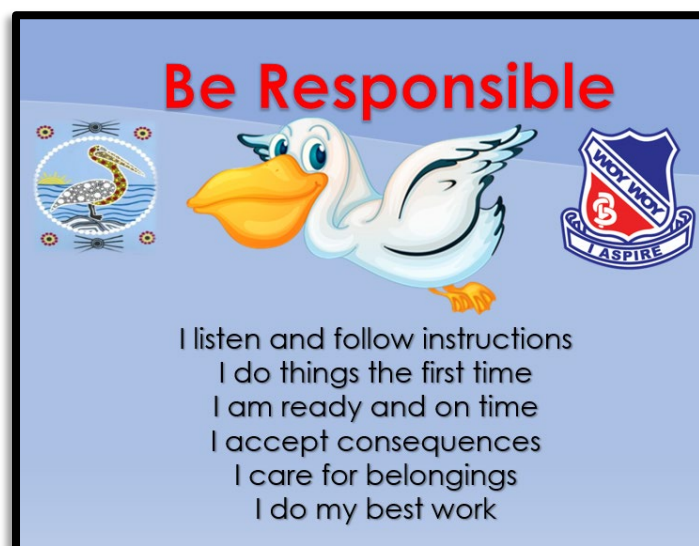

# Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) Weeks 7 & 8



This fortnight our Positive Behaviour for Learning expectation has been 'Be Responsible' especially when on the playground. Students have been practising responsible behaviours whilst on the playground including waiting for their turn when using equipment and following the rules of games being played. Next fortnight we will continue our focus on safe playground behaviours and students and teachers will be discussing the importance of staying 'in bounds' and not playing with sticks. Students who demonstrate our 3 school expectations will be rewarded with Win Bin tickets for their efforts and stars on their Star Charts.



## Zones of Regulation

This week we have been learning what our brains have to do with our feelings. Our feelings are valuable and help us to understand ourselves. When we know what Zone, we are in and can see patterns across the day, it is our brain that helps us to regulate or change our Zone back to Green (Good to Go, calm, content, happy). Thinking skills are the core of emotional regulation. All other strategies (calming and sensory Week 6 and 8) support and enable us to engage with thinking strategies. This week we will begin with size of the problem. All our size scales are different from each other due to our experiences. None are "wrong" - just different. You may want to watch the clip "Why do we lose control of our emotions?" ### Lesson 4: Exploring Thinking Strategies: Strategy 1 – Size of Problem

This lesson is an introduction to thinking strategies and is designed for students to learn the basic vocabulary of the size of a problem and how it relates to the levels of emotions people experience and expect within various situations. Students will evaluate the size of problems using a visual scale, analyse the emotional responses to those problems and look at how some responses may be disproportionate to the level of the actual problem.

#### HOW CAN YOU HELP?

- ✓ Continue Zones check-ins before, after school and at other times of the week.
- ✓ Have you begun to recognise patterns or chatted about patterns of triggers across the day?
- ✓ The first thinking strategy: The Size of the Problem talks about intentionally rating or scaling our problems as a way of coping with difficult or less difficult situations.

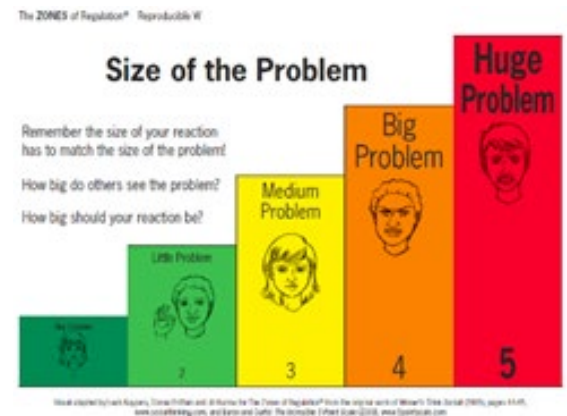
Talk with your child about a time when you might have “blown out of proportion” a situation. What did you learn?

- ✓ We learn empathy by recognizing that we all have different scales. Can you think of people from different cultures or countries who might have different size of problem scales to us here at Bateau Bay? Do you think the scales might be different between students and parents at our school too? What can we learn from this?
- ✓ **Talk to your Classroom Teacher if your discussions have raised important thoughts.**

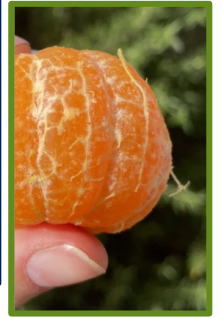
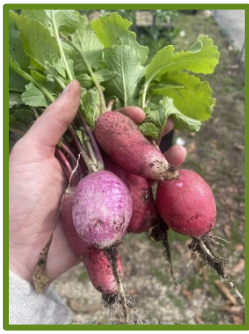


# Gardening Club

# Making a Coolamon

In our Gardening lessons students from Stage 3 spent time with Patrick our Aboriginal Education Worker. Patrick discussed with the students that they were going to make a Coolamon, this will be used when we collect produce from our Garden to be used in our Kitchen, ditching the plastic bowls!

Students got the opportunity for hands on learning, using tools to cut the Coolamon from the tree, to peel the bark off and to sand it back to have a smooth finish. Patrick explained to the students the process of picking a tree and asking for permission from our Ancestors and paying respect to the tree afterwards by rubbing Mother (dirt) on it.

He also explained that traditionally Aboriginal People would use stone tools instead of our modern-day metal tools. Students were also taught about how the tree will now become a Scar Tree, but the tree will keep growing without any issues as hard wood inside of the tree wasn't cut into and damaged.

Students thoroughly enjoyed this hands-on learning experience and are looking forward to the next opportunity to learn from Patrick.

# Great Aussie Bush Camp



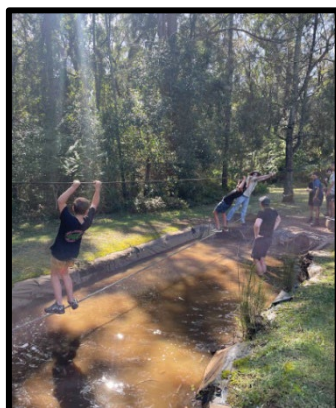
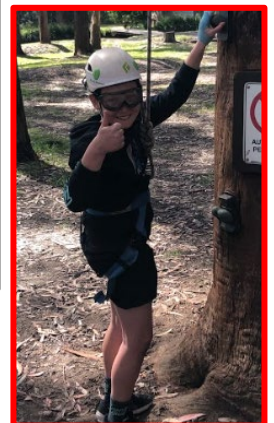
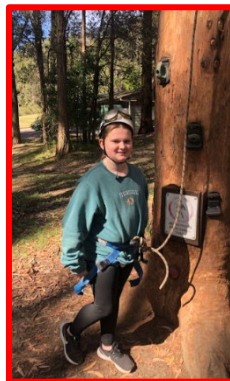

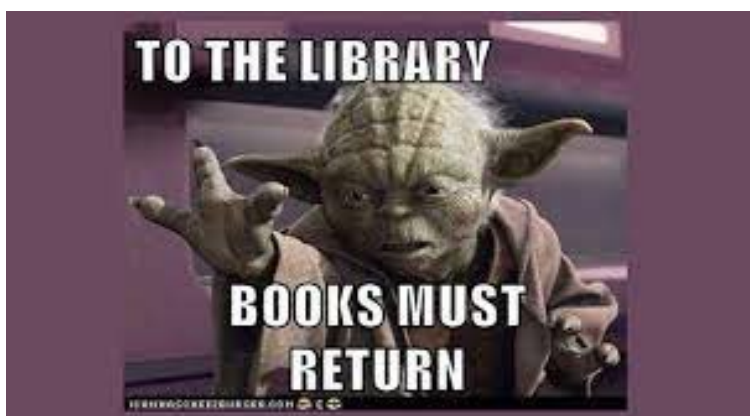


# Library News

### Changes to Going Home Arrangements

Could you please ensure that your child is aware of how they will be going home in the afternoon. If these arrangements change during the day, it would be appreciated if you could contact the office prior to 2:00pm to ensure that the message is passed on to your child.

## FAQ

### What if I order the wrong size?

## Refund, Exchange & Returns Policy

The Uniform Shop will accept returns and provide customers with an exchange, refund or repair where the customer can provide adequate proof of purchase by way of receipt and the following terms and conditions are followed:

- Exchanges can only be made within 14 days of purchase.
- No refund will be given for an incorrect size choice only an exchange and the item must have original tag and have not been washed and is in an "as new" condition.
- All faulty items need to be reviewed by the manufacturer before a decision is made regarding refund, repair or exchange.
- Any item to be reviewed by the manufacturer needs to be returned in a clean and freshly laundered condition.
- The Uniform Shop will not hand out replacement items until the manufacturer has decided on repair, refund or exchange. This process may take several weeks.
- All decisions will be notified to the customer.
- The Uniform Shop reserves the right not to offer an exchange, refund or repair on items where the item fault is the result of misuse, neglect or incorrect washing instructions of the item.
- The Uniform Shop reserves the right to assess the condition and age of returned goods prior to providing a repair, refund or exchange. This may result in repair, refund or exchange being refused.
- If a refund is granted, the refund will be issued to a nominated bank account.

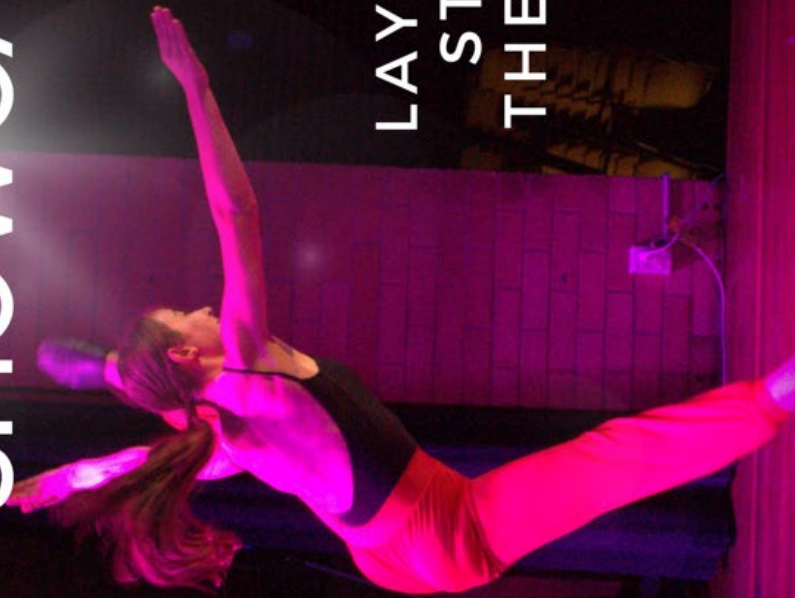
