## Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) Weeks 7 & 8



Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) is a whole-school framework that promotes positive behaviour across our school. At Woy Woy Public School we strive to create safe classroom, playground and online learning environments. Behavioural expectations are explicit, fair, consistently applied and jointly constructed. This enables the classrooms and playgrounds to be predictable and thus safe. Strategies used to support this include:

- having clear expectations, structures, routines and accountability systems that promotes responsibility from all stakeholders
- fostering positive language and inclusive play at recess and lunch
- providing 'safe' places for students to go at recess and lunch
- quality and active supervision of playground and common areas by teachers
- greeting students as they enter classrooms and checking in with them regularly

This fortnight teachers and students have been discussing how to be Responsible on the playground. Lessons and activities have focused on the importance of following the rules of games, wearing school hats outdoors, sharing equipment and staying in supervised areas.

Sitting alongside our PBL expectations is our whole school **Zones of Regulation** program. Each week we teach social and emotional skills and enhance self-regulation through the whole school Zones of Regulation program. Teachers integrate social and emotional learning into teaching and learning programs and set practical tasks and cooperative activities that promote problem-solving, social skills, negotiation and communication.

### **Mindfulness for emotional wellbeing**

Mindfulness is about focusing attention on the present, rather than focussing on the future.

Research shows that mindfulness:

Increases self-awareness, social awareness, and self-confidence

Increases emotional self-regulation

Reduces the severity of depression, anxiety and ADHD

Builds resilience.

Each day students across our school practise mindfulness and a variety of other strategies used to support emotional regulation. Some of the activities students regularly participate in are below and I encourage you to try them at home with your child/ren.

**Mindful breathing:** Close your eyes and think about your breathing. Breathe in through your mouth and out of your nose. Can you feel the air coming into your mouth? Can you feel it coming out of your nose? What does it feel like? Can you feel the rise and fall of your chest or stomach? If you can't feel anything, place your hand on your stomach and notice how your hand gently rises and falls with your breath. Remind yourself that trees release the oxygen we inhale and absorb the carbon dioxide we exhale. As we breathe, we are borrowing air before returning it to nature.

**Blowing bubbles:** Notice their shapes, textures and colours.

**Colouring:** Colour something. Focus on the colours and designs.


**Listening to music:** Focus on the sound of just one instrument – the drums is a great one to start with.

**Squeezing muscles:** Starting at your toes, pick one muscle and squeeze it tight. Count to five. Release, and notice how your body changes. Repeat exercise moving up your body.



## Breakfast Club

Our dedicated staff continue to run a Breakfast Club on Monday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday mornings. This year we have toasted over 16,485 slices of bread, used 270kg of margarine, 265 jars of jam and over 30 jars of Vegemite. We are very grateful to Bakers Delight Woy Woy who continue to donate bread each week and we would like to thank our team of volunteers and community members who donate many of the spreadable items we use.



## Attendance Matters

Education for your child is important and regular attendance at school is essential for your child to achieve their educational best and increase their career and life options. NSW public schools work in partnership with parents to encourage and support regular attendance of children and young people. When your child attends school every day, learning becomes easier, and your child will build and maintain friendships with other children.

## Days missed = years lost

A day here and there doesn't seem like much, but...



### What are my Legal responsibilities?

Education in New South Wales is compulsory for all children between the ages of six years and below the minimum school leaving age of 17 years. The Education Act 1990 requires that parents ensure their children of compulsory school age are enrolled at, and regularly attend school, or, are registered with the NSW Education and Standards Authority for home schooling. Once enrolled, children are required to attend school each day it is open for students.

### The Importance of arriving on time:

Arriving at school and class on time:

- Ensures that students do not miss out on important learning activities scheduled early in the day
- Helps students learn the importance of punctuality and routine
- Give students time to greet their friends before class
- Reduces classroom disruption Lateness is recorded as a partial absence and must be explained by parents.

### What if my child has to be away from school?

On occasion, your child may need to be absent from school. Justified reasons for student absences may include:

- being sick, or having an infectious disease having an unavoidable medical appointment
- being required to attend a recognised religious holiday
- exceptional or urgent family circumstance (e.g., attending a funeral)

Following an absence from school you must ensure that within 7 days you provide your child's school with a verbal or written explanation for the absence. However, if the school has not received an explanation from you within 2 days, the school may contact you to discuss the absence. Principals may decline to accept an explanation that you have provided if they do not believe the absence is in the best interest of your child. In these circumstances your child's absence would be recorded as unjustified. When this happens, the principal will discuss their decision with you and the reasons why. Principals may request medical certificates or other documentation when frequent or long-term absences are explained as being due to illness. Principals may also seek parental permission to speak with medical specialists to obtain information to collaboratively develop a health care plan to support your child. If the request is denied, the principal can record the absences as unjustified.

## Spooky Potato and the Messy Bedroom


2W are proud to be published authors after their class picture book 'Spooky Potato and the Messy Bedroom' was received at the school this week!







### Changes to Going Home Arrangements

Could you please ensure that your child is aware of how they will be going home in the afternoon. If these arrangements change during the day, it would be appreciated if you could contact the office prior to 2:00pm to ensure that the message is passed on to your child.

### Skoolbag APP and Website

You can download the WWPS Skoolbag APP to both iPhone and Android devices. Event updates and important information will be sent out via our Skoolbag APP, and you can record your child's absence from school here as well. ## FAQ

### What if I order the wrong size?

## Refund, Exchange & Returns Policy

The Uniform Shop will accept returns and provide customers with an exchange, refund or repair where the customer can provide adequate proof of purchase by way of receipt and the following terms and conditions are followed:

- Exchanges can only be made within 14 days of purchase.
- No refund will be given for an incorrect size choice only an exchange and the item must have original tag and have not been washed and is in an "as new" condition.
- All faulty items need to be reviewed by the manufacturer before a decision is made regarding refund, repair or exchange.
- Any item to be reviewed by the manufacturer needs to be returned in a clean and freshly laundered condition.
- The Uniform Shop will not hand out replacement items until the manufacturer has decided on repair, refund or exchange. This process may take several weeks.
- All decisions will be notified to the customer.
- The Uniform Shop reserves the right not to offer an exchange, refund or repair on items where the item fault is the result of misuse, neglect or incorrect washing instructions of the item.
- The Uniform Shop reserves the right to assess the condition and age of returned goods prior to providing a repair, refund or exchange. This may result in repair, refund or exchange being refused.
- If a refund is granted, the refund will be issued to a nominated bank account.

# School Travel

### Term 4 2022

#### 2023 school travel applications are now open

Applications for student travel in 2023 open from **Monday 10 October 2022**.

Students who need a School Opal card or travel pass for 2023 can [apply](#) now. A new application will need to be submitted if they are applying for the first time, or if they are requesting an additional travel entitlement as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation (e.g. joint custody).

Students who change address, school, campus location, have repeated a year or received an expiry notification from Transport for NSW for their school travel entitlement should [renew or update](#) their details before **the end of term 4**. This will ensure that schools can endorse applications, and entitlements remain valid for the start of the 2023 school year. School Opal card holders will have the changes applied to their existing card.

If a student's distance eligibility has changed based on their grade (i.e. grade two to grade three), the system will automatically update their entitlement if they meet the new criteria. If they do not meet the new [eligibility criteria](#), we will send an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition that is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

[Term Bus Pass](#) holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

Students in the Opal network applying for an Opal card (including a Term Bus Pass) for the first time will receive their Student Opal card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2023.

Students living in rural and regional (R&R) areas should receive their travel pass at the start of the new school year from their nominated transport operator. It may come via the school or be sent directly to them at home. **Note:** some R&R operators do not issue travel passes. Students/parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

#### Travel from Term 1 2023

We ask that parents plan ahead and make sure their child knows which service/s to use and has a valid ticket to travel; either a School Opal card or Child/Youth Opal card (within Greater Sydney) or a School Travel Pass (outside Greater Sydney), from the start of the school year.

Applications for 2023 School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS) travel open at the start of Term 4 2022, so parents/students can [apply](#) or [update](#) details early and be ready for the start of the new school year.

Most students using the Opal network will not need a new Opal card and can continue travelling on their existing card each year.

The start of the year is a busy period for local transport operators, and students travelling without a valid ticket make service planning and operations difficult.
