SASS Appreciation Week

Next week is SASS Appreciation Week here at WWPS. It was an opportunity for the staff of Woy Woy Public School to acknowledge the wonderful work done by all of our School Administrative Officers – Sandra, Kath, Sharon and Marnya, our School Administrative Manager – Linda, our GA – Macca, and all of the amazing School Learning Support Officers (SLSOs) who work with children in classrooms. We consider ourselves incredibly lucky to have such dedicated, hard-working and professional people working in the school for the benefit of students and family and community members. They all do an absolutely amazing job and we as a staff were happy to be able to spoil them a little bit over the course of the week.

Camps and Excursions

Term 3 is excursions term here at WWPS. Year 4 spent Monday and Tuesday of last week at the Great Aussie Bush Camp in Kincumber and had an absolute ball from all accounts. Our Year 5 students returned to school yesterday after heading over the mountains to visit Bathurst on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday of this week. There are some great photos on the school's Facebook page if you'd like to check out what they've been up to. The teachers who accompanied both groups (Year 4 and Year 5) - Mrs Louise Rayner, Mr Matt Wolski, Ms Vicki Phipps, Mr Wayne Price, Michelle Young and Mrs Amy Ford, reported that the students' behaviour was immaculate. I'd like to congratulate our students for challenging themselves, supporting each other, enjoying themselves and treating everyone at the respective camps and venues with respect. We'd also like to thank the teachers who supervised the excursion for the extra hours they put in for the benefit of the students.

Next week it's Year 3's turn. They're heading down to the Field of Mars Environmental Education Centre in Gladesville to participate in their 'Survivor' program, which involves a host of activities and physical challenges designed to test their mettle. Sounds like loads of fun! Can't wait to hear the stories they bring back with them. Thank you to Miss Natascha Lenz, Mr Matt Wolski and Mrs Amy Ford for running our students through their paces at this excursion.

NAPLAN Results

As you're probably aware, student achievement on the National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) tests is being reported in a different manner this year to what it has previously been. Student achievement is being reported on using proficiency standards for each assessment area, at each year level. The four proficiency levels are:

'Exceeding': The student's result exceeds expectations at the time of testing.

'Strong': The student's result meets challenging but reasonable expectations at the time of testing.

'Developing': The student's result indicates that they are working towards expectations at the time of testing.

'Needs additional support': The student's result indicates that they are not achieving the learning outcomes that are expected at the time of testing. They are likely to need additional support to progress satisfactorily.

Parents of students in Year 3 and Year 5 have already received individual student reports detailing the standards their child has achieved on each of the assessments. It is of interest to all parents however, to examine the data obtained for all students in Years 3 and 5.

Writing proved to be an area of strength for our Year 3 cohort with 74.47% of students achieving Exceeding or Strong assessment standards, as did Reading, with 65.96% of students achieving Exceeding or Strong assessment standards for Spelling. Numeracy and Grammar and Punctuation appear to be the areas in need of increased focus for Year 3 students, with 51.06% and 46.81% of students achieving Exceeding or Strong assessment standards and 51.06% of students achieving Exceeding or Strong assessment standards respectively.

For our Year 5 cohort, Reading proved to be an area of strength with 66.67% of students achieving Exceeding or Strong assessment standards, as did Spelling, with 64.7% of students achieving Exceeding or Strong assessment standards for Writing. Once again, Grammar and Punctuation and Numeracy appear to be the areas in need of increased focus here at the school, with 54.9% and 50.98% of students achieving Exceeding or Strong assessment standards respectively. These results are not unexpected for neither Year 3 nor Year 5, and it is hoped that the schoolwide focus on professional learning on Multiplicative Strategies and Vocabulary for teachers will address the issue and see improved results on these assessments next year.

Kindergarten 2024

The second of our Principal's Tours/Open Classrooms sessions is to be held next Wednesday 6 September. If you know anyone who's thinking of enrolling their child (or children) here next year but hasn't yet done so, this is a great opportunity for them to have a good look around, to see some of our educational programs in action, and to get inside the Kindergarten classrooms to see how it all works. Please let them know that they're welcome to join us next Wednesday.

Enrolments for both Kindergarten and for the Guliyali Preschool for 2024 are open. The WWPS Guliyali Preschool was rated 'Exceeding' in all seven Quality Areas of the National Quality Standard last year by ACEQCA. Places are filling up fast for 2024. As this goes to press, four places remain for the Seahorse group, and only three places for the Pelican group. Please contact the office as soon as possible if you wish for your son/daughter to attend our preschool next year.

Afternoon Traffic Congestion on Park Road

More than one person has contacted the school in recent weeks to express concern about the incorrect use of the 'Kiss and Ride' zone outside the doors to the school's office. Here's what the Service NSW website has to say about Kiss and Ride zones:

"Kiss and Ride Zones are designed for your convenience and for your child's safety. Designed for quick entry and exit, these zones minimise congestion and risk when used properly by all parents and carers. These zones operate under the same conditions as no parking zones, which means you:

- may stop to drop off or pick up children for a maximum of 2 minutes.
- are required to remain in, or within 3 metres of, your vehicle..."

The fact that people are sitting for, in some cases, a lot longer than the two minute maximum means that far from having the effect of minimising traffic congestion, the opposite is in fact the case – they adding to, perhaps even causing, congestion problems. We therefore ask that all parents who use the Kiss and Ride zone, do so in the spirit intended and stop for no more than two minutes. Doing so will allow more motorists to use the zone, and as a consequence we hope to see fewer vehicles stopping in the 'No Stopping' zone. We ask that you please comply with these road rules for the sake of the safety of the students of Woy Woy Public School.

Tell Them From Me Parent Survey

Later this term we will once again ask you to take the time to complete the 2023 Tell Them From Me Parent Survey.

The parent survey helps to clarify and strengthen the important relationship between parent and school. The survey is designed to measure, assess and report insights from the parent point of view at the school and system levels. The focus of this NSW survey is on student wellbeing, engagement and effective teaching practices. The survey questions aim to understand parents' perspectives on their child's experience at school, including teaching, communication and the school's support of learning and behaviour. The survey will ask questions about whether parents feel welcome, whether parents are informed, whether the school supports positive behaviour, whether the school supports learning, whether the school promotes safety and inclusion, and which means of communication parents feel are most effective as a means for exchanging information.

Survey responses are anonymous so staff in schools will not be able to identify individual parents or students from parent responses. Data collected from the survey responses are compiled into reports for school leaders. The reports provide information that can help schools in their annual planning and reporting activities, by helping to identify emerging issues and plan for improvement.

Participation in the survey is entirely voluntary but greatly appreciated. Please keep your eye out for a link to the survey in the coming weeks. I can't emphasise enough how valuable the data from this survey is to the school in terms of planning for school improvement. Thank you in advance for your commitment to helping us to continue to strive to meet the needs of our community.

Bathurst

Year 5 students had a wonderful time in Bathurst this week.

Student took part in two hands on activities during our first tour. We investigated Aboriginal people's use of natural ochres and identify it use in artworks then painted their own boomerang in symbols to take home as a souvenir. Secondly, students will throw a returning boomerang in a safe wide-open space.

Students interacted with personalities from the past and get their hands dirty building mudbricks, damper cooking, operating old machinery and panning for gold.

The Courthouse is an opportunity for students to explore the architectural significance of a key landmark and its connection to the success of shaping Australia.



Ethics classes at Woy Woy Public School

Dear Parents and Carers,



Could you be an ethics coordinator for Woy Woy Public School?

The ethics coordinator communicates with school staff, supports ethics teachers, and liaises with Primary Ethics, the not-for-profit organisation approved to design curriculum and training for the program.

This role provides a great opportunity for a working parent who might be unable to volunteer during school hours and is a rewarding way to engage with the school community. Times are flexible, requiring approximately 1-2 hours per week. Online training is provided.

In ethics classes, children learn how to think logically, disagree respectfully, and support their arguments with evidence, rather than act according to blind habit or peer pressure.

Children discuss topic such as:

- imagining how others feel
- how do we treat living things?
- what is laziness?
- how do we disagree in a respectful way?
