The playground will undergo significant improvements, including excavation work to install a new drainage system and resurfacing the asphalt from the preschool area to the car park. We will also replace the existing mismatched shelving with new cabinetry along the B-Block hallways, providing a more cohesive and functional environment. PBL & Zones of Regulation

Positive Behaviour for Learning

Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) is a whole-school framework that promotes positive behaviour across our school. At Woy Woy Public School we strive to create safe classroom, playground, and online learning environments. Behavioural expectations are explicit, fair, consistently applied and jointly constructed. This enables the classrooms and playgrounds to be predictable and thus safe. Strategies used to support this include:


- having clear expectations, structures, routines, and accountability systems that promotes responsibility from all stakeholders.
- fostering positive language and inclusive play at recess and lunch.
- providing 'safe' places for students to go at recess and lunch.
- quality and active supervision of playground and common areas by teachers greeting students as they
 enter classrooms and checking in with them regularly.

This fortnight teachers and students have been discussing how to 'Be Responsible' on the playground. Lessons and activities have focused on the importance of:

- only using the equipment when a teacher is present
- taking turns
- keeping your hands and feet to yourself

Students who are demonstrating positive behaviours are rewarded with 'Yali Tokens', which are accumulated throughout the term and traded in to receive a reward.





PBL Rewards Day

On Friday 4 April, all students at Woy Woy Public School will celebrate their positive behaviour at our PBL Rewards Day. Each student will be able to select a reward which is based on the amount of Yali Tokens they have received throughout the term and linked to our school values of 'Be Responsible, Be Respectful and Be Engaged'. Next week, information will be sent home showing which reward your child has selected. We look forward to seeing how our Rewards Day systems transform throughout the year. 

The National Young Leaders Day 2025





Message from the Office



Important Parking Message

The staff parking area inside the school gates on both Park Road and Bowden Road is for **Staff Use Only**. Parents dropping off and collecting their children from school, Music Bus, or Cubbyhouse BASC are asked to park outside the school grounds. This is a Department of Education directive.

Office Hours

Could you please ensure that your child is aware of how they will be going home in the afternoon. If these arrangements change during the day, it would be appreciated if you could contact the office prior to 2.00pm to ensure that the message is passed on to your child.


